## CUBS CAPTURE 12TH VICTORY IN FIFTEEN STARTS

### Art Nehf Winning Pitcher In Highly Important Contest —Champion Cardinals Fall Further In Mire of Third Place.

(By the Associated Press.) The impending battle between the American league Titans tended somewhat to dim the fury of the National league battle yesterday, and caused the auxiliary campaign in the American league to miss all but passing attention. For all of this fact the rejuvenated Cubs shelved Grover Cleveland Alexander and others sufficiently to shade the Cardinals by 7 to 6 for the fourth straight Chicago triumph. The Giants whaled the Phillies by 11 to 6 and the Braves won another from the Robins, 4 to 2, in remaining National league fixtures.

The Pirates and the Reds were idle. Results in the National league gave the Cubs a somewhat more comfortable margin over the Pirates, and dropped the champion Cardinals further into the mire of third place. The gain of the Giants, except in regard to their immediate designs upon third place, was negligible. The American league campaign yesterday consisted of victories for Boston, Detroit and Chicago. The Athletics and the Yankees, of course, were idle. The Red Sox rallied to pull out a 5 to 4 decision against Ad Laska and Brown in Washington as MacFayden checked the Senatorial attack at eight hits. Young Ed Walsh pitched four-hit ball against St. Louis to win by 5 to 3, and the Detroit Tigers hit hard to win by 8 to 4 over the Indians in Cleveland.

The victory of the Cubs, the most important achievement in either circuit yesterday, gave the Bruins a record of 12 out of their last 15, including their run of four against the champions. Art Nehf was the winning pitcher yesterday, although he had to have the help of Charlie Root at the finish. Only two of the four starting Chicago pitchers in the St. Louis series finished, but this could be charged to well-grounded nervousness on the part of Joseph McCarthy. The 7 to 6 victory yesterday was marked by Hack Wilson's fifteenth and sixteenth home-runs, and by one from the bat of Andy High of St. Louis.

## SPANIARDS AID UZCUDUN TRAIN FOR BIG BOUT

Y., (AP)—Such is the making Spanish style up here at the training camp of Paulino Uzcudun, the world's heavy-weight champion, hopes to serve up a steaming hot dish of it when he battles Max Schmeling at the Yankee stadium June 27. Paulino is trained, doctored, fed and entertained by Spaniards. Arthur Uzcudun's old associate from his rookie fighting days, is the trainer. Dr. Angel L. Sesma is the camp physician and constant companion of the big chin glower. Gregorio Garay is the chef and Santos Escoberrria is the second cook, or the bull cook, as the boys in the lumber camps would have it. The four of them run the camp for their celebrity of clout. And they all double in something or another to provide a well organized force. Arthur attends to the shopping. Dr. Sesma sells tickets to the paying guests attending the daily workouts. Garay besides running the kitchen supervises the evening entertainment hour. He sings and, like the others, plays a mean guitar. Escoberrria helps in the kitchen, waits table, serves as valet and when the crush at the gate gets too heavy for the doctor sells pasteboards at the gate. The cooking staff has some leisure during week days. Paulino dines only twice daily. But it isn't his eating as much as it is his generosity that sometimes makes work for the culinary crew. Saturdays and Sundays, when the royal Spaniards from as far distant as New York flock to camp, dozens are waved into the grove back of the house for coffee and sandwiches. The battling Basque is about the busiest man in camp. He doesn't work. He just moves about, in and out of the house to kiss the Basque babies, greet the pretty girls from Hoosick and vicinity and decline the inevitable invitations to play tennis and golf with the fair ones. Enel welcomes all and sends them away smiling. Serving as one of the major figures in boxing is not at all annoying to him and he snubs no one.
