

COMMISSION IN RHINELAND NOT GERMANS' PRICE

Stresemann Says Installation of Commission As Price of Evacuation Not Satisfactory — Guilt of War Also Irks.

BERLIN, June 24.—(AP)—The nationalists today submitted to the Reichstag a no confidence motion against Dr. Gustav Stresemann, German foreign minister for the past five years.

BERLIN, June 24.—(AP) Foreign Minister Stresemann told the Reichstag today that Germany would not stand for the installation of a commission in the Rhineland as the price of its evacuation.

At the same time he declared that President Von Hindenburg and the members of the cabinet would support the manifestations this week against the treaty of Versailles especially the clause by which Germany acknowledged sole guilt for the war.

The foreign minister's statements were made in the course of a speech replying to severe criticism by Count Westary, leader of the nationalists.

The foreign minister declared that the newly drawn up Young plan was a definite improvement over the Dawes plan from the viewpoint of the burden on Germany.

"No, we are not a colony of Frenchmen and Englishmen," he said. "To me it seems doubtful whether all Europe is not in danger of becoming colonies of those who are luckier than we."

The fact that the colonies sat down together to work out amelioration for each other because others did not give them amelioration—that is something that cannot be removed from the history of the Paris negotiations.

MEXICAN WOMAN TRIED TO POISON HUSBAND'S RIVAL

MEXICO CITY, June 24.—(AP)—The Mexican wife of an American citizen was in jail here today charged with attempting the murder of another American in the depths of an African jungle.

The alleged attempt came to light only with the arrest last night of Mrs. Soledad Morales De Learn, whose husband was a professional competitor and rival of William A. King, who captures wild animals and sells them for a living.

King, who recently arrived here with two hippopotami for the Chapultepec zoo, told police he had learned from employees that Mrs. Learn was plotting his death with a view to removing him as a competitor from her husband's business field.

A friend of his, Senora Juana Fernandez, made the acquaintance of Mrs. Learn and, King alleged, was commissioned by her to poison him. After false news had appeared in newspapers that he had been poisoned and would not recover, two detectives who accompanied Senora Fernandez said they overheard Mrs. Learn exclaim: "At last, and now he'll pay money to Senora Fernandez."

"Shopping" for Peonies

Peonies must be planted in the fall months, but if you would make an intelligent selection of varieties you need not wait until blooming time. Preventing Plant Rust

When snapdragons are covered with small brownish pustules of rust, dust the plants with superfine sulphur. But do not wait until the plants are covered with the disease and then expect to do much good. Begin the treatment when the plants are young. This same treatment will help to keep hollyhocks free from a similar rust disease.

To Guard Phlox Leaves

Phlox leaves turn yellow and die as a result of the attacks of red spider and mite. Applications of dusting sulphur will hold these troubles in check or dusting with copper-bone dust, when the plants are wet with dew will keep the leaves green. It will probably be necessary to make four or more such applications up to the time the flowers are produced.

Farm Notes

Thoroughness of application is essential in codling moth control, finds the Oregon experiment station. Worm injury can be prevented only when the entire surface of every apple and pear is entirely covered with arsenical spray, preferably 2 to 4 pounds of lead arsenate powder to 100 gallons of water.

Tuberculosis of chickens, which shows most severely in fowls over one year old, is evidenced by a gradual loss of flesh, the birds often becoming extremely emaciated, with comparatively little flesh on the breast bone, while the head becomes pale and the comb shriveled. In occasional cases lameness is shown, and in advanced cases there is frequently evidence of diarrhea. If the internal organs of such fowls show whitish lumps and lesions, there is little doubt that tuberculosis is present, says the Oregon experiment station.

To rid fowls of lice, apply Black Leaf Forty to the top of the roosts with a small paint brush just before the birds go up for the night. One application lasts for at least two days, and usually kills all or most of the lice, finds the Oregon experiment station.
