

GOLF TOURNEY TO START HERE ON SATURDAY

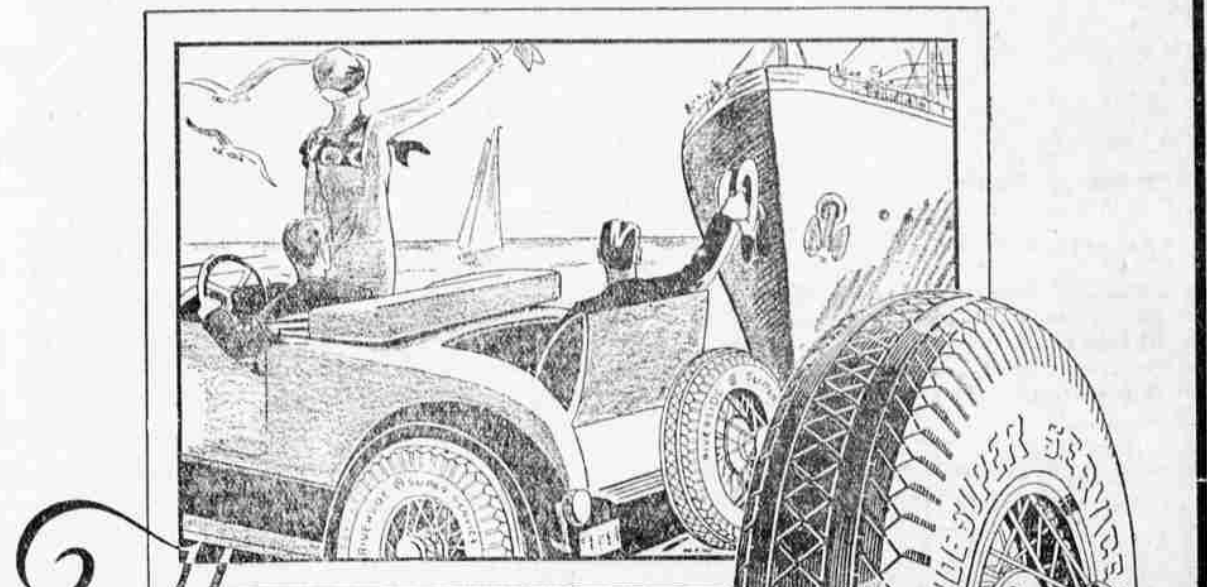
