

KING SELECTS HYMNS FOR RECOVERY SERVICE

LONDON, June 28.—(AP)—Two hymns selected by the king have been included in the form of service to be used by the free churches at the thanksgiving services for his majesty's recovery from his illness on July 7. "All People That On Earth Do Dwell" and "Praise My Soul, the King of Heaven."

The service at Westminster abbey to be attended by the king and queen will not be a state ceremonial, but will just afford the formal opportunity for their majesties to join in the empire's general thanksgiving. The smallest number possible of seats in the abbey are to be reserved and the definite suggestion has been expressed from the highest quarter that the people should attend their usual places of worship.

OPINIONS IN FOUR CASES ANNOUNCED BY JUDGE NORTON

Four opinions were handed down in circuit court by Judge Harry Norton late yesterday afternoon, before his departure for Grants Pass, where he is holding a jury case today. He will return to the local court Monday.

In the P. K. Nalley case vs. the First National bank, B. E. Harder, as executor of the alleged last will and testament of William A. Pointer, deceased, J. C. Case, Gilbert Case, his wife, and Anna C. Nalley, the court decided in favor of the defendant. The case was represented by Porter J. Neff for the defendant and Charles Reimes, Harry Skyrman and Judge Phillips for the plaintiff.

The case of George L. Treichler vs. the Medford Lumber company and J. T. Gagnon, in which the mechanic's lien of G. G. Knowlton was assigned to Treichler, the decision was in favor of the plaintiff. This case was represented by Kelly & Kelly for the plaintiff and Porter J. Neff for the defendant.

The case of Grace Merrill vs. George Merrill for alleged contempt of court in the failure to pay alimony, was decided in favor of the plaintiff, represented by Frank DeSouza. A. E. Romnes represented the defendant.

The case of C. E. Reichstein vs. E. M. Richman and B. E. Richman, involving action on a promissory note brought by the plaintiff to recover \$250.00 with interest and attorney's fees, and to which the defendant brought a counter claim for \$705 for services and materials, was decided in favor of the plaintiff, represented by Porter J. Neff. The defendant was represented by G. M. Roberts.
