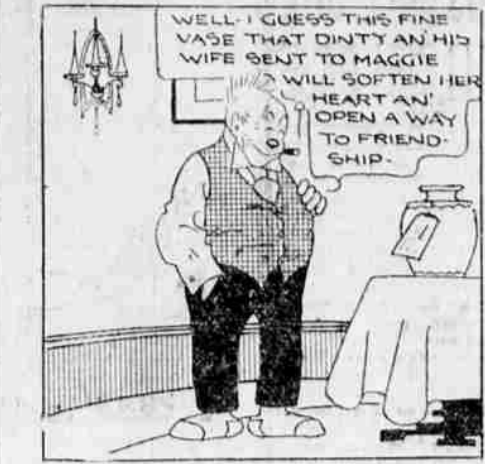


REV. J. E. CONDER AGAIN NAMED FOR LOCAL PASTORATE

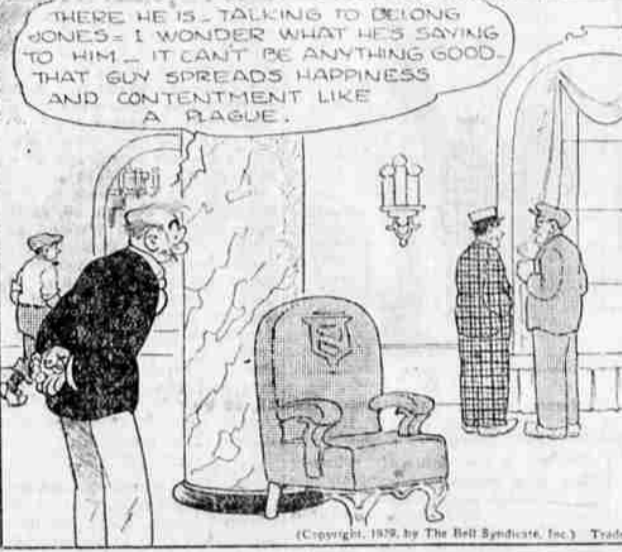

PORTLAND, Ore., July 1.—(AP)—Watermelons, peaches and fresh fruit prices remained steady over the week-end. With supplies increasing and a large production indicated in all sections, watermelons were slightly cheaper today, being quoted at 3 1/2 to 5 1/2 c. The outlook is that watermelons will be in many years. Strawberries were also lower because of their rapid ripening. The best brought \$1.65 Monday. Green beans are swamping the market at 3 cents a pound. Beans were abundant at 8 and 10 cents. Cantaloupes are still high and will remain so until after the fourth.

Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, July 1.—(AP)—The stock market faltered before a large call money rate today, which ranged from 10 to 15 per cent, the highest since mid-May, but rallied briskly toward the close when fresh funds came into the market and fears of a further advance in the rate vanished. Old Elevator was rushed up 29 points, International Business Machines nearly 13 points, Packard Motor, General Electric and Union Carbide six points or more. Bonds were markedly strong, several issues rising three to nearly eight points to new high ground. The close, however, was somewhat irregular, a number of issues showing net losses of one to three points.
