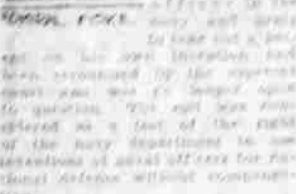


BOMB INVENTION BRINGS ADMIRAL HUGE JUDGMENT
