COAST GOLFERS HOPE TO GRAB WESTERN TITLE

KANSAS CITY, July 6.—(AP)—Resplendent in its championship dress, the Mission Hills course here is ready for the attack of 114 golfers who will compete for Frank Delp's grown in the thirteenth annual western amateur tournament which begins Monday and continues all week.

The Portland amateur, who won last year over the Frenchman Bob O-Link course in Chicago, will not defend his title but Don Moe, a fellow townsman, and Charles D. Hunter Jr., of Tacoma, Wash., and Johnnie De Paolo, Bakersfield, Cal., will attempt to carry the championship affair to the Pacific coast. Among the favored contenders is the veteran, Charles (Chick) Evans of Chicago, who will try for his ninth title.

Shorter by 850 yards than the Bob-O-Link layout, the well-trapped greens make Mission Hills a difficult par 72. The greens are well conditioned, the fairways are closely cropped and the rough will force an erring player to resort to a strong, well played shot to bring his ball back into the fairway.

The starting order will be reversed for the 18 holes Tuesday. Match play will begin Wednesday. Quarter finals Thursday, semi-finals Friday and finals Saturday all will be over the 36-hole route.

Wilson, who is in jail as a material witness in the killing, was regarded as a close friend of Marlow and was under his management at one time in his boxing career.

Discrepancies in his story of the events of the day, and evening of the slaying have caused police to subject his statements to rigid scrutiny.

When first questioned, Wilson denied that Marlow had answered the telephone in the restaurant where they with four others had dined on the night of June 27 and from where Marlow went to his death in Flushing Queens.

Confronted with the statement of Humbert J. Fugazy, that Wilson as well as Marlow had used the telephone, the former boxer admitted both calls. He said his call was made to a bookmaker, Danny Murray.

GRID MENTORS OF O.S.C VISIT HERE

Paul J. Schisler, head football coach at Oregon State college, accompanied by Lon Steiner, who was all-American tackle and captain of the Nebraska team in 1925, and who is now freshman coach at Oregon state, was registered at the Hotel Medford Saturday.
