500,000 STEELHEAD TO BE LIBERATED

G. C. Robertson of the bureau of fisheries, department of commerce, in charge of the Elk Creek hatchery, made the following public announcement today: "I would like to announce in the columns of your paper, for the benefit of the sportsman and general public, and especially those who fish in the Rogue river above the present rack site of the bureau, that the pickets this year on our head rack have been spaced two and one-half inches apart, enabling most all the small salmon and steelhead to a weight of about 10 pounds to go through with ease, also we have recently installed an electric pump, which throws approximately 450 gallons per minute, enabling us to carry on fish cultural work during the hot summer months; have dredged the present ponds to an average depth of three and one-half feet and are now feeding 500,000 steelhead, which will be liberated late in the present hatchery site."

PLANE PLUNGE KILLS MARINE CORPS FLIERS IN SHAFT EXPLOSION

QUINCY, Mass., July 10. (Special.)—Second Lieutenant George R. Stephens, 34, U. S. marine corps, and Gunnery Sergeant Ernest D. Jones, 21, were instantly killed here late yesterday when their plane plunged from an altitude of nearly 2,000 feet into the waters of Squantum Bay, directly off the Squantum naval base. Both men were dead when extricated from the cockpit.

Stephens came from San Diego where he was a post commander of the American Legion post. He had served in the air forces in the World war. Jones, unmarried, was a native of Maypearl, near Dallas, Texas.

WELSH MINERS PERISH IN SHAFT EXPLOSION
