

### FAULTY BRAKES BRING DEATH ON GREEN SPRINGS

Mrs. Susan A. Day, 65, of Sunnyside, Washington, was instantly killed on the Greenspring mountain at 5:15 last night when the Ford car driven by her grandson, Clifford Day, 29, succumbed to faulty brakes. Hit the inside embankment and rolled over, pinning the victim beneath it.

Her head and chest were badly crushed.

The car of the peaceful contractor, thrust the driver from the car, trampling him severely and causing shock, but saving his life. The screams of the woman as the machine first overturned were heard by H. C. Smith of Ashland, A. Poston and H. E. Teffer, who, having completed their work, were returning to their homes in the near vicinity.

A notification card in the purse of Mrs. Day assisted the men in locating relatives in Ashland, who soon after the accident arrived at the scene and took the injured driver in charge. The body of Mrs. Day was taken to Ashland by Joy Walker, deputy coroner.
