She also had three years with the army medical corps of the Canadian Expeditionary forces overseas during the war period, and was awarded a medal for distinguished service, together with a personal message from the king of England.

MRS. KING HANDS IN RESIGNATION AS HEALTH NURSE

Mrs. King is one of the pioneer nurses in public health work. During her career in Canada, she was forced to make most of her calls through the country on horseback, and became an expert horsewoman. This becoming one of her favorite sports, she later rode in the horse shows of New York and Canada, taking part especially in the ladies' hunting and saddle classes. She has also followed the dog shows closely and has shown her own dogs in the east upon several occasions.

During her activity here, Mrs. King has managed to keep up with her horseback riding and may ride some of the thoroughbred horses owned by her and her husband on the stock ranch in New Mexico, in the Denver show next year.
