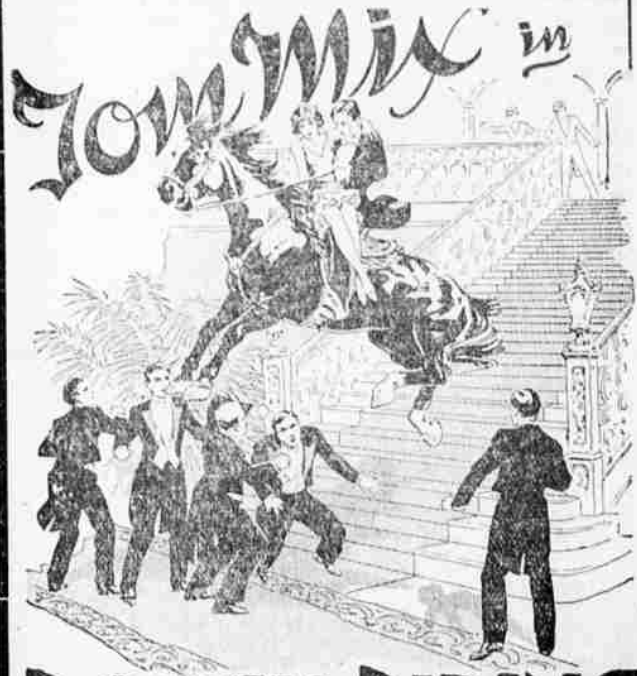
Rev. Griffith preached a very interesting sermon last Sunday afternoon immediately after Sunday school, which was enjoyed by all.
