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BOYS FACE JUDGE FOR TAKING FRUIT FROM S. P. CARS

The six local boys, who for three consecutive nights had plundered Southern Pacific cars and carried off an aggregate of from \$15 to \$20 worth of fruit and produce, and on the fourth night broke into the Swift & Company warehouse where they took three hams and a side of bacon, spent the greater part of this forenoon before Judge Sparrow and the juvenile authorities. Accompanied to the court house by their parents, five of the boys probably will be released on a condition of future good behavior.

The seal was broken by the boys on the Southern Pacific car before the theft took place. The first night a large haul of bananas was taken; the second night, watermelons, and the third night, cantaloupes. The three hams and a side of bacon taken from the Swift company were found by the officers on the roof of the ice plant, where the boys had attempted to hide them.
