

TOMMY QUILTS AS LIGHT HEAVY AFTER VICTORY

Loughran Lays Aside Crown Which He Successfully Defended Last Night—Will Enter Ranks Heavy Contenders.

NEW YORK, July 19.—(AP)—Tommy Loughran announced today that the lightweight throne was vacant and that he would seek the permission of various boxing commissions to campaign hereafter as a heavyweight. "From now on I am going to fight at my normal weight, which will preclude my continuing in the 175-pound division," he said. "I intend to give up the crown and see what I can do among the heavyweights, the authorities, of course, willing."

NEW YORK, July 19.—(AP)—Tommy Loughran was still ruler of the light heavyweight brigade today and James J. Braddock, Jersey City puncher, had only a boxing lesson to show for his meteoric climb to the rank of contender.

Meeting Braddock in a 15-round titular battle at the Yankee stadium last night, Loughran stilled up points with a snatching left hand and won the decision beyond a question. Not once during the struggle could Braddock land squarely with his right hand, without which the Jersey youngster would not have deserved to be in the same ring with the champion. With that right hand Braddock had broken Pete Latta's jaw; knocked out Tuffy Griffiths in two rounds and stopped the Buffalo spectator, Jimmy Slattery, in nine rounds. Against Loughran, however, Braddock could find no use for his most potent weapon. Outspeeded and outsmarted all the way, the Jersey lad found the champion's left always ready to catch the wild overhand rights that came his way.

Never has Loughran appeared to better advantage. His educated left hand spent most of the evening in Braddock's face. With it he kept the challenger off balance, thus neutralizing the undoubted power Braddock has in his fists. Of the 15 rounds Braddock won only two. There were no knock-downs, nor even a threat of one, but there was plenty of blood. Loughran bled freely all through the fight from bad cuts, one over his left eye and the other in his scalp. Braddock was troubled by blood that streamed from a gash alongside his right eye. A crowd of 25,000 saw the scrap with a "gate" in the neighborhood of \$200,000. Loughran weighed 174 pounds; Braddock 170.

Dave Shado, California veteran, surprised the experts by punching his way to a decision over Rene Devois, crack Belgian middleweight, in the 10-round semi-final, which was put on after the main bout. Each weighed 158.

PREACH OF GOD INSTEAD OF MAN ADVICE AT SYNOD

ALBANY, Ore., July 19.—(AP)—Urging his hearers to "preach about God," and to "get rid of man worship," Dr. Henry W. Wilson, director of the board of national missions of the Presbyterian church, yesterday was a speaker at the conference of the Oregon Presbyterian synod here. Ministers and elders from every section of the synod attended the meeting.

Consolidation of the Southern Oregon and Coos Bay Presbyteries was the most important business before the synod, and was favorably acted upon. The resulting presbytery now reaches from the western boundary of Lake County to the Pacific ocean, and from the California line to the Umpqua river. It embraces 27 churches and a membership of 3035, and has 31 ministers in its jurisdiction. The Rev. Joseph Snyder of North Bend was elected moderator representing the consolidation. Other officers are: Rev. J. W. Angel, Gold Beach, stated clerk; Rev. Henry Haight, Klamath Falls, permanent clerk; Rev. R. W. Acher, Roseburg, temporary clerk; Rev. Hugh Mitchell, Astoria, reporting clerk. More than one hundred ministers and elders attended the synod.

HOOVER PROPOSES REIMBURSE FRUIT GROWERS FLORIDA

WASHINGTON, July 19.—(AP)—President Hoover proposes to reimburse Florida citrus growers for damages in connection with federal activities for the extermination of the Mediterranean fruit fly. Mr. Hoover announced today that after congress reconvenes he will recommend an appropriation for this purpose. The amount necessary, he said, cannot be predicted at this time beyond the rough estimate that it will run into several million dollars.

POTTER TAKES LEAD LONG BEACH GOLFERS

LIDO COUNTRY CLUB, LONG BEACH, N. Y., July 19.—(AP)—Arthur Potter, unattached pro formerly of Marine and Field club, with an almost unbelievable 64, six strokes under the Lido course record, took the lead in the metropolitan open championship late in the afternoon of the second day. The amazing score placed Potter at the top of the list, as he had so yesterday and his 36-hole total of 144 shaved a stroke from Leo Diegel's count of 145.

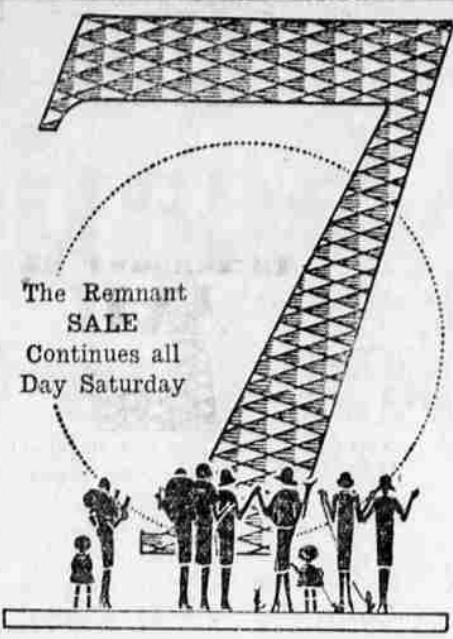

NEW YORK, July 19.—(AP) Disregarding the establishment of a new high record in federal reserve tickets, the stock market continued to move upward today, although the advance was by no means uniform. Buying operations were conducted with considerable vigor in a varied assortment of steel, public utility, can, electrical and railroad shares, a dozen of which moved into new high ground. Several of the motor and oil stocks were conspicuously heavy. Call money renewed at 8 per cent, but the volume of funds became so plentiful the rate was dropped to 7 in the early afternoon. The close was firm. Total sales approximated 4,100,000 shares.
