WEATHER MODERATE AS COMPARED WITH HEAT OF LAST YEAR

Now tell everyone, as they read this news item, cross their fingers and rag on wood, for the weather did so before starting to relate that while the Medford so far has been enjoying very nice summer weather as regards temperature for this time of year, the city a year ago today was in the midst of one of those nasty heat waves with a maximum of 106 or more for seven consecutive days, the maximum of a year ago today being 105, following a maximum of 104 the day before. The latter was the highest temperature for all last summer.

This heat wave, which began on July 21, had the following daily maximums: July 21, 102; July 22, 106; July 23, 105; July 24, 25 and 26, 103; July 27, 100. The temperatures then began to gradually recede until normally was reached.

Still keep your fingers tightly crossed and a chunk of wood handy, as the statement is now going to be written that the highest temperature of this summer so far was 98, reached on July 4, and the next highest was 97, reached on June 22.

The above are official figures obtained at the local weather station from the under observed, Kenneth Anderson, who capped on his head lightly as he gave them and endeavored to cross his feet, which are a part of his six feet two inches height and about 230 pound weight.
