

POPULARITY OF PARK GROWING REPORT SHOWS

Travel to Crater Week Ending July 20, Increased Over Same Week Last Year—Animal Life Plentiful This Year.

The travel to Crater National park this year so far continues to be of huge volume, according to the official figures given out by the National Park Service.

The travel report for the week ending July 20, shows that 2949 people in 1233 private cars, and 193 people who went there by the park stages visited Crater lake, whereas for the same week last season 2664 people visited the lake in 3020 private cars, in addition to 70 persons by the stages.

This is an increase of 2.8 per cent in people and of 3.07 per cent in cars, and increase of 45.1 per cent in stage travel. In addition, five persons visited the lake that week by other mode of travel.

The report of the total travel for the week was 11,064 people and 3642 cars, as against the 1228 travel for the corresponding week—2744 people in 2929 cars, making a 12.5 per cent increase in people and 20 per cent increase in cars.

Previously reported to last week was 29,963 people and 9274 cars.

Thus the total attendance figures for this season up to the week ending July 20 were 41,027 people and 12,816 cars. The travel for last season for the same period was 41,328 people and 12,544 cars, making this season's increase in cars up to that time 2.2 per cent and a decrease in people of 7 per cent.

The season does not end until September 20.

Animal life in Crater Lake National park is plentiful this year. The bears returned early and are in good condition. Deer are reported daily along the rim road. Possibly the most interesting report received from visitors and rangers is that of a small group of elk, seen along the rim road on the east side of the lake. These elk are part of a herd placed in the Klamath Indian Reservation

several years ago. The herd has increased to over two hundred head, and now that they have been reported within the park boundaries we may expect that this feature may be added to the many others, which the tourist may enjoy.

The new trail down the inner rim to the water edge of Crater lake was dedicated early this season. The trail was completed last year. It was cleared of snow this year on July 21st and on the following morning the secretary of the Interior, Ray Lyman Wilbur, accompanied by Horace M. Albright, director of the national park service, E. C. Sollinsky, superintendent of Crater Lake National park and others prominent in the park service rode down to the water on horse-back.

Because Crater lake and the surrounding region is entirely of volcanic origin the question often arises as to whether there are any evidences of present day volcanic activity. The geological survey, under Joseph S. Diller, many years ago studied the lake temperatures and found no difference between the temperature just under the surface and that at the bottom two thousand feet below.

No hot springs or fumaroles have been discovered about the base of Mount Mazama, but a recent discovery by Chief Ranger Godfrey of a mineral spring in Anna Creek canyon brings the possibility of other similar finds. The water of this particular mineral spring is heavily charged with chemical compounds, and specimen bottles are being sent to laboratories for analysis.

Field parties of geology students from prominent eastern universities visit Crater lake annually, and because of the marvelous opportunities to study the various phases of vulcanism they often extend their stay beyond the expected schedule. The first party for this season included 11 students from Vanderbilt University, Nashville, Tenn., under the direction of Dr. N. Jewell.

LARGE DANCE CROWD EXPECTED BY LEGION

One of the largest dance crowds of the season is anticipated when the American Legion dance takes place at the Jackson Hot Springs pavilion next Saturday, July 27th. An excellent program of the latest popular dance hits has been arranged by Don Provost for the occasion and a good time is said to be assured for all who attend. BURY SINNOTT AT THE DALLES PUBLIC SERVICE

Friday Morning Ceremony in City Auditorium—Butler Will Deliver Eulogy—Pallbearers, Include High Officials.

THE DALLES, Ore., July 24.—(AP) Funeral services for Nicholas J. Sinnott, for many years representative in congress from the Second Oregon district (eastern Oregon) and recently appointed justice of the United States court of claims, will be held here Friday in St. Peter's Catholic church. Public services will be held at 9 a. m. in the city auditorium, to be followed by religious rites at 10 a. m. in the church. State officials and others prominently identified with the state will attend the services.

Robert R. Butler, Representative Sinnott's successor in congress will deliver the eulogy at the auditorium service. Requiem mass will be celebrated in the church at 10 o'clock and interment will be in the Catholic cemetery here.

The body will reach The Dalles tomorrow afternoon and will rest in state in a funeral chapel here until 8 a. m. Friday.

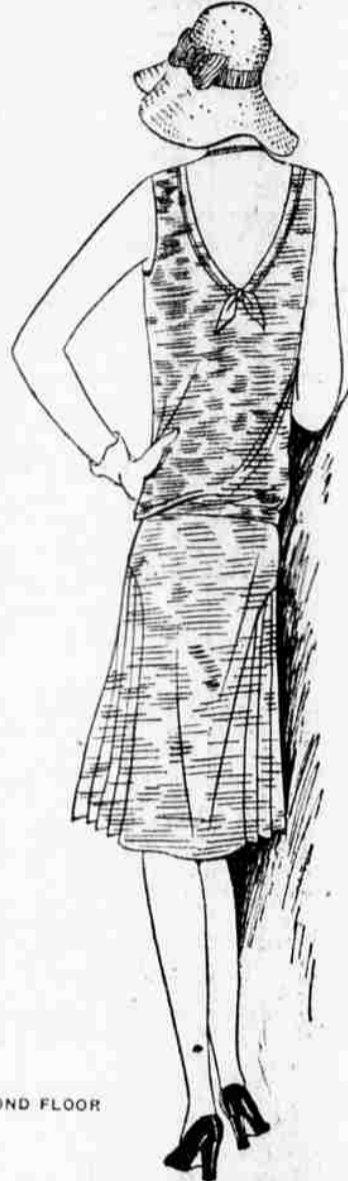
