

BUTTER PRICE ON MOVE UPWARD IN PORTLAND DEALS

PORTLAND, Ore., July 24.—(AP)—Butter prices took a short all around today. Extras and standards went up one cent and firsts half a cent. Butterfat advanced to 44c station and 45c track, with the Portland delivery price quoted at 47c. The advance is in keeping with the firm tone which has characterized the market for several days.

First values were unchanged. First receipt of telephone peas from the coast area arrived today. They are 10 to 12 cents wholesale.

The east side market of the Gardeners' and Ranchers' association is having one of the biggest and most profitable summers in its history. Although produce is abundant, the members have little trouble in getting all they can bring in at profitable prices.

Local peas, with the season at its tail end, sold higher Wednesday at 4 to 5 cents; French beans were down to 8; yellow bantam corn was lower at 60c; while pie cherries declined to 8c. Other prices were:
