PLANE ALIGHTS ON SHIP DECK BY FLOOD LIGHT

First Feat of Kind in History Accomplished on Airplane Carrier Saratoga—Moffett Witnesses Air Experiment.

SAN PEDRO, Cal., July 25.—(AP)—What naval authorities here believed to be the first feat of its kind in aviation history was accomplished last night when one of the planes of the U. S. S. Saratoga took off and landed successfully on the illuminated deck of the huge airplane carrier while the ship plowed through the waters off Los Angeles harbor.

FIRE GODDESS STIRS KILAUEA INTO OUTBURST

Slumbering Volcano of Hawaii Throws Lava 400 Feet in Air—Many Motorists Visit Pit Despite Torrential Rain.

VOLCANO HOUSE, island of Hawaii, July 25.—(AP) Pele, goddess of the volcano, who has slumbered since February, was active today at the "house of everlasting fire" in Halemauana, five pits of the Kilauea volcano.

The first eruption, at 6:30 o'clock yesterday morning, was signaled by four fountains of lava that shot 150 feet into the air. They gradually grew stronger thru the day until the columns attained a height of 400 feet while myriads of smaller fountains appeared through the crater.

Lava from the fountains covered the old black mass of lava left by the February eruption and the floor of the pit changed into a flaming cauldron.
