### MONSTER SIGN TO DIRECT AVIATORS

The Owen-Oregon Lumber company will start work soon upon the painting of a sign bearing the words, Medford Airport, upon the roof of the crane shed of the local plant. The sign will be one of the largest of its kind on the Pacific coast, being 20 feet high and 200 feet long. A huge pointer will show the way to the airport. The sign will be visible for miles in all directions, and at more than the ordinary flying heights. The work will be under the supervision of City Engineer Fred Schorler. The expense will be borne by the Owen-Oregon company. The sign will be painted in the official aviation colors—chrome yellow and black. The sign is the suggestion of Ben Alexander, an aviation enthusiast, and a director of the Owen-Oregon company. On a visit here last spring, he said he intended to fly to this valley as soon as the sign was painted.
