It is well known that the farmer receives very little above cost of production for his products and for garden produce, etc., he usually receives less than cost of production. Yet the consumer pays a very high price for what

he buys. In the interests of both the producer and the consumer a public market is deemed a necessity, owned, operated and managed by the farmers.

The marketing committee of the Pomona Grange is urged to attend an important called meeting with the Farmers Exchange directors and manager at the Farmers' Exchange on Friday night, August 2nd.

The marketing committee of the Pomona Grange are the chairman of each subordinate Grange marketing committees. Other members of the local Grange marketing committees should also attend this meeting and so keep in touch with the vital problems affecting our marketing and marketing organization. It is urged that all members of Pomona committee attend.

A special meeting has been called to discuss legislative problems for Saturday, August 19, at Central Point Grange hall, 8 P. M.

The Pomona recommends an agricultural survey of the county and will co-operate with any organization to this effect.

The road committee was instructed to see that something is done to prevent the destruction of our roads by heavily loaded trucks. The Grange was in favor of having a school for fruit packing in order that more labor help may be available for this work and to reduce the need of hiring outside help.

It was decided to hold a meeting for initiatory work at any Grange whenever a class sufficiently large to warrant the same is ready.
