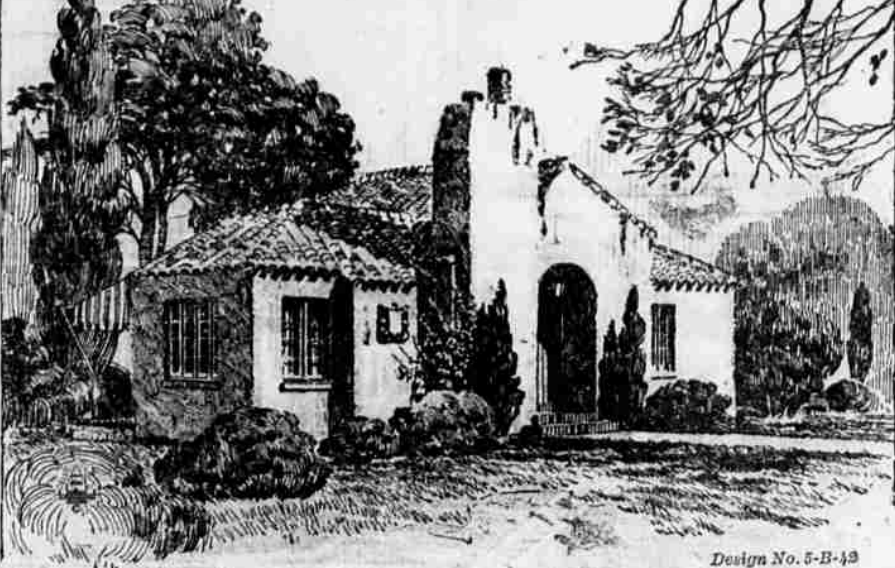
Foundation Walls And Basements of Durable Concrete

By the Architects' Small House Service Bureau of the United States, Inc. A strong, durable foundation is the first requirement for every good building. Whether the structure is a towering skyscraper or a small home, sound footings and foundations are a necessity.

Water-Tight Walls Below Grade It costs much less to build a water-tight wall than to repair a leaky one. Consequently, the time to make a basement wall water-tight is when it is built.

In each case a line of drain tile is placed entirely around the outside of the footing and is connected to a sewer or dry well. The excavation above the tile is filled to within a foot of the grade line with gravel, cinders or other suitable material.

Popular Bungalow in Masonry

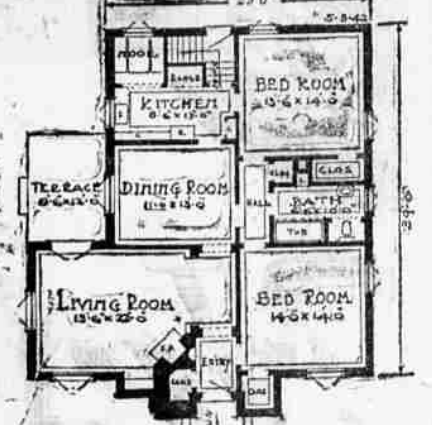


Here Is a Complete House Carefully, Beautifully, Designed

What You May Want to Know About Building

- Q—What can be done to stop wood from rotting? This is in floor joists. The basement is not excavated. There is a space of 18 inches between ground and under side of joists. A—Wood rots when it is damp and not otherwise. The fungus causing rot requires moisture. The cure therefore consists in removing the cause of moisture.

HUGHES FILLS VACANCY INTERNATIONAL COURT

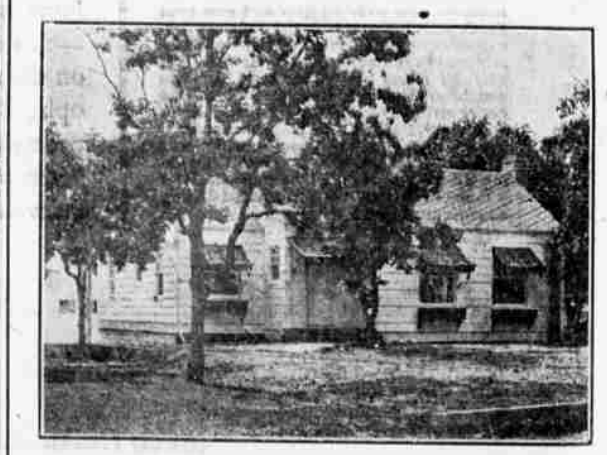
