

SURPLUS SUPPLY REDUCES BUTTER

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 2.—(AP) Because of surplus supplies, prime firsts and seconds in butter declined half a cent, the former to 42 and the latter to 41. Other grades were undisturbed.

The egg market showed no change. The lemon price continued its flight today. Another advance of \$1 was added to a similar advance of Thursday.

Peaches were more plentiful with a slight recession in values. A fine consignment of Crawfords was received today, ranging in price from \$1 to \$1.25.

Watermelons and cantaloupes were firm, with the watermelon price particularly stiff. No movement was expected until about August 10, when northwest melons begin to arrive.

Abundant supplies at the East Side market failed to affect prices. Growers had no trouble in selling all their produce. Apricot supplies were large, but the demand was proportionate. The price was still around 90 cents and \$1. The fruit was reported of unusually fine quality and a great deal of it was being canned. Prices of other products were stationary.

NEW YORK, Aug. 2.—(AP) Bullish operations were resumed with considerable vigor in today's stock market, with major speculative interest shifting from the public utilities to the railroad shares. More than a score issues were pushed into new high ground, many of the gains running from 5 to 15 points.

Call money remained at 10 per cent, but the banks appeared to be in a more comfortable position and a lower rate is expected.

Late trading saw American Telephone and Telegraph reach 29 1/2, a jump of 11 points, Lechele (Gas) was up 20 points, Buffalo and Susquehanna recovered 1 1/2, Industrial Rayon and Pacific Telephone and Telegraph 10, while Atchafon, National Biscuit and Behm Aluminum rose 8 points each. The closing was strong. Total sales approximated 4,000,000 shares.
