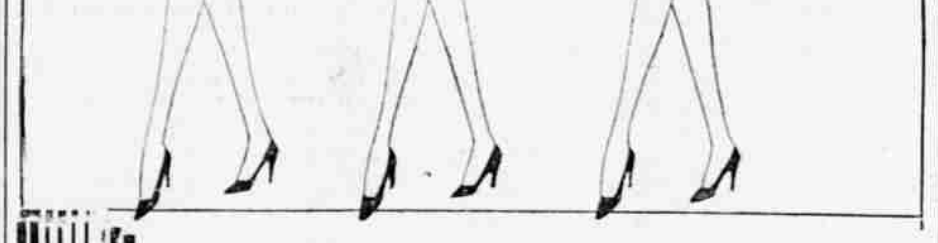
OREGON AIRMAN GETS SERVICE DECORATION
