BED, BATHS AND KITCHEN SINK IN TOUR APARTMENT

A complete modern apartment on wheels passed through the city this morning en route to Oakland, Cal. The car constructed at a cost of \$5000 in Omaha, Neb., by W. L. Doty and contains everything from a stove and ice box to shower baths and beds. Mr. and Mrs. Doty and their son, W. L. Jr., and daughter, Martha, and two chauffeurs — they also have a Chrysler 88 sedan — left Omaha June 28 and are making a tour of the United States. They have been north as far as Vancouver, B. C., and are going to Southern California, Texas, New Orleans, Washington, D. C. and expect to arrive home in October.

The equipment in this luxurious car includes two 30-gallon water tanks one hot and one cold, ice stove, writing desk, dining table for five, one double and one single bed, an ice box, a pantry, sink, wardrobe, electric fan and lights and also an outside observation platform. The "apartment," which Mr. Doty, who has a commercial line in Omaha, ordered especially for the trip is built on an international bus chassis. The hot monkey, which was in the car, attracted considerable attention from passers-by. The party left for Oakland, Cal., via the Redwood highway this afternoon.
