Belgrade, Jugoslavia, Aug. 2.—The long arm of the law reached out across the 14 years and the wreck of an empire today to sentence Captain Pirc, formerly of the Austrian gendarmery, to be hanged for shooting a Jugoslavian in 1915.

Captain Pirc was shown by testimony to have shot the farmer, Marco Djilic, without trial, on suspicion of spying while the Austrian armies were occupying the northern part of Serbia in 1915. Djilic, while hunting for a lost horse, entered the gendarmes barracks, where he was captured and shot by order of Pirc.

Djilic's relatives began suit immediately after the end of the war and the trial ended only recently. Captain Pirc appealed from the decision.
