FOREST HILLS, N. Y., Aug. 10.—(AP)—Helen Wills clinched the Wightman cup for America today but it took one of the hardest-won triumphs of her career to turn back the challenge of her youthful English rival, Betty Nuthall, and regain the emblem of women's tennis supremacy for this country.

For nearly an hour, while a gallery of more than 9,000 spectators sat thrilled in the big west side club's stadium, the queen of the world's courts was played to a standstill by the bounding, impetuous rush of the 18-year-old English girl. Expecting a one-sided victory, the crowd was startled instead by one of the most dramatic rallies of Miss Wills' career as well as one of the biggest upsets of the tennis season.

Queen Helen won, finally, by scores of 8-6, 8-6, applying the winning touch in identical fashion in each set, but for 56 minutes of flashing action the American was given the sternest battle she has had in three years.

NAVY SEAPLANE EXPECTS TO BEAT 318 MI. PER HOUR

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Aug. 10.—(AP)—A slight accident to the propeller in taxing prevented test flights today of the Mercer with speed flier, hopes to wrest the Schneider seaplane racing trophy from Great Britain.

The propeller was bent, perhaps by striking some object drawn up when the water, while Williams was considering taxing tests on the Severn river, off the Naval academy, late yesterday. The accident was not discovered until today when the propeller was sent to the Annapolis naval air station at Washington for repair.

Monday morning Williams, however, hopes to take the little seaplane into the air for tests which will determine if it is to be taken to England to compete in the Schneider races against British, French and Italian speed creations. The races will be held off Cowes, Isle of Wight, Sept. 6 and 7.

It said it probably would get off the water at 170 miles an hour in a calm sea.

"Some wonder why I do not take off," Williams said. "If they were in the cockpit, they would know. I have to feel it out and learn just what it will do. No one can tell me, I have to find that out for myself."

GOTHAM BULLDOG IS BADLY WANTED FOR GOLF THEFTS

NEW YORK, Aug. 10.—(AP)—Police today were hunting for "Mashie," a bulldog said to be the most accomplished golf ball thief that ever trotted across the Van Cortlandt park links.

"Mashie" was missing because, after bluffing a detective—an order, police said, from her master—she apparently got a hunch something was wrong, and scampered away.

The master, Frank Conroy, of an address, was imprisoned in Morrisania court today and held in \$500 bail on a charge of luring "Mashie" to grab the balls and bring them to him in the bushes, so that he could sell them back to the players and thereby collect enough to buy their daily rations of beans and bones.
