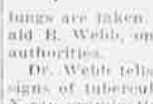

It has been fairly well recognized by the medical profession that tuberculosis is advanced beyond the incipient or first stage by the time tubercle bacilli are found in the sputum, as a general rule.

Now, then, can the important question be settled in any case promptly enough to give the patient the advantage of early care and proper treatment?

Suppose the doctor's opinion does not turn out to have been wrong. Suppose you enter a tuberculosis sanatorium and after a sojourn there find you haven't tuberculosis at all.
