

HITCH HIKERS CROP SURVEY TO ATTACK WOMEN BE DISCUSSED WHO GAVE LIFT ON WEDNESDAY

Beaten and Slashed With Razor, Victims Bound and Left in Pasture To Bleed To Death — Clothing, Money, Car Taken.

HOXIE, Kas., Aug. 12.—(P) The victims of two young hitch-hikers they had given a ride from Colorado, Miss Jeda Beaugreard, 21, and Mrs. Beatrice Walsh, 44, both of Concordia, Kas., were in a hospital today with injuries received in an attack near here Sunday night.

Nude, beaten and slashed with a razor and apparently abandoned to bleed to death, the two women were found bound in a pasture east of Hoxie by a ranch foreman. Physicians said they would recover.

Miss Beaugreard, a telephone operator and Mrs. Walsh, a widow were returning from a vacation trip when they were lured by the two young men near Limon, Colo., they said. The youths, about 20 years old, were well-mannered and asked for a ride saying they were returning to their home in Kansas City. The attack, the women said, came without warning.

Overpowering them the youths slashed the women with a razor, bound them with rope and cast them into the pasture. Stripping them of their clothing and money the youths drove off in Mrs. Walsh's car. They have not been captured.

SANTA FE PASSENGERS ARE BADLY SHAKEN UP

PUEBLO, Colo., Aug. 12.—(P) One woman was slightly injured and sixty passengers were badly shaken when several coaches of a Santa Fe train, Chicago bound, left the rails twenty miles east of here today.

The chief dispatcher's office here reported today that the derailment was caused by what is known as a transverse interior fissure. This is explained as a crack on the inside of a rail and is said to be difficult to locate. The engine, two baggage cars, and a mail car passed safely over the rail but the first Pullman was derailed, causing the other cars to leave the tracks.

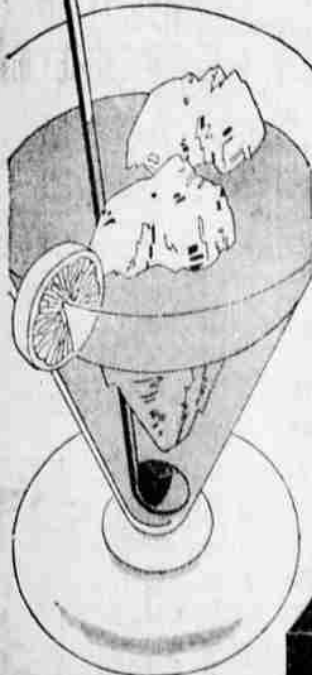

LABOR UNIONS OF SPAIN FLAY CONSTITUTION

Premier De Rivera Attacked In Manifesto To People—Proposed New Spanish Constitution Declared Worst of All.

MADRID, Spain, Aug. 12.—(P) A manifesto to the Spanish people strongly attacking Premier Primo De Rivera was issued by the General Labor Union in session here after the convention had refused to accept the government's invitation to send five representatives to the national assembly.

The vote was overwhelmingly against the government's invitation. Observers attach much political significance to the labor union's action. The manifesto opposes and severely criticizes the proposed new Spanish constitution.

"The Spanish people, thirsting for liberty and justice, will not be deceived by false promises of social reforms in the new constitution," the manifesto declares.

"The Spanish working classes are becoming stronger and better organized, and will not forget 'our goal is socialization of the country's resources. We aspire to free democratic republican government.'"

"The manifesto says the new constitution gives excessive and arbitrary powers to the king. It says: 'Every Spanish constitution has been bad, but this is the worst of all.'"

"Under the new constitution the government can at any time annul the few liberties it still gives the country," says the manifesto. "There never has been conceived a more complicated and impractical system of great absolutism than conceived by this new constitution."

BLAME FORD FOR ANCIENT AUTOS LITTERING LAND

NEW YORK, Aug. 12.—(P) Henry Ford, as the man most responsible, has been asked by Borough President Harvey of Queens to help solve the problem of disposing of abandoned cars.

Professing to see a situation which in time will tax the resources of the nation for its elimination, Mr. Harvey requested Mr. Ford to lend his automotive genius to abating the nuisance of streets and vacant lots littered with discarded automobiles, a large proportion his own product.

"We have yet to find an effective method to combat this 'Frankenstein monster,'" Mr. Harvey wrote. "You have personal knowledge of the conditions caused in most of the nation's towns and cities by the promiscuous discarding of old cars."

"As the most prolific producer of automotive equipment in the world I think your company should bear a large part of the responsibility for the elimination of the abandoned car problem."

ELECTRIC SCREEN WILL SAVE TROUT AT SAVAGE RAPID

GRANTS PASS, Ore., Aug. 12.—(P) The state game commission yesterday completed installation of an electric fish screen at Savage Rapids dam, a few miles south of here. The screen is designed to keep tiny trout out of the irrigation pump and machinery.

Chains carrying electricity and acting as electrodes are suspended in the water from parallel wires stretched across the face of the intake. Fish are said to give the electrified area a wide berth, similar screens are being installed at other dams in southern Oregon.

ROLLER COASTER RIDE KILLS TWO

ST. LOUIS, Aug. 12.—(P) A 13-year-old girl and a man, 23, were instantly killed in an amusement park here last night when they were thrown from a car on a roller coaster as it made a turn at the top of an incline, 40 feet above ground. Two employees of the device were arrested for the conspiracy.

The girl, Helen Brockmeyer, was thrown to the inside, her body landing on a lower track. The man was tossed to the outside, his death being caused by a broken neck.

The two employees held were James I. Schmickel, the brakeman, and Maxnard Shonemaker, the engineer who created the device, and was in charge of its operation. The coaster was only opened last Saturday.

INTEREST KEEN IN PRIZES FOR ESSAY ON BOSCO
