Menus to Be Used Friday By Miss Warner in Her Lesson

Tomorrow, the closing day of the cooking course Miss Warner's topic for discussion will be, "New Cakes for Special Occasions."

You will be delighted to get recipes especially appropriate for the bride's shower, the birthday party, the company dinner or the club luncheon. Some of the recipes will be as follows:

Bride's Shower Cake
2 cups sugar, 2 cup butter, 2 eggs, separated, 3 cups sifted pastry flour, 2 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Prune Cake
3/4 cup sugar, 2 yolks or other (at 1 cup sugar, 2 yolks or 1 egg, 1/2 cup prune juice (unsweetened), 1 cup diced cooked prunes (unsweetened), 2 cups sifted pastry flour, 2 tablespoons cocoa, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon nutmeg, speck of cloves, 1 teaspoon soda.

Angel Food Cake
13 cups egg whites, 1 teaspoon cream of tartar, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 cups sugar, 1 cup sifted pastry flour, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Bake at 310 degrees (low oven) about 1 1/2 hours. Invert pan until cake is cool.

Graham Cracker Cake
1/2 cup butter or substitute, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 3 eggs separated, 1 cup milk, 3 cups finely rolled graham crackers (about 3 1/2 1/2 teaspoon salt, 3 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 cup chopped walnuts.

Cream butter and sugar thoroughly together, add egg yolks unbeaten and mix them in. Add vanilla to creamed mixture. Stir baking powder and salt into the cracker crumbs, then add dry ingredients alternately with the milk to the creamed mixture. Add nuts and beat well. Lastly fold in egg whites beaten stiff. Bake in two layers in a moderate oven 350 to 400 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Put layers together with grape jelly and cover the top of cake with whipped cream. Garnish as desired.
