

SENORA GIVES HUSBAND AND SON TO REVOLT

Venezuelan Woman Sacrifices Jewels and Family To Cause of Liberation From Gomez Regime—Husband Is Killed.

NEW YORK, Aug. 16.—(AP)—Senora Luisa Delgado, attractive wife of General Ramon Delgado-Chubbard, who is reported to have been killed leading the revolt against the government in Venezuela, initiated Queen Isabella in offering her jewels for a cause dear to her heart.

Senora Delgado also offered her husband and eighteen-year-old son to the cause of Venezuelan liberation from the Gomez regime. General Delgado is supposed to have been killed, but the son escaped to Granada, a British island.
