Grants Pass Chamber of Commerce Resolution Regrets Medford Effort Secure Redwood Highway Connection

WHEREAS, the attention of the Grants Pass Chamber of Commerce has been directed to the efforts of certain citizens of Medford to effect another connection from that city to the Redwood highway, and

WHEREAS, the Grants Pass Chamber of Commerce is reminded of the fact that large sums of county money have been expended on the Redwood Highway and grants of labor upon the part of citizens of this community have been given to bring California tourist business into the state of Oregon, and being about better transportation facilities to the harbor at Crescent City, and

WHEREAS, this money and these efforts have resulted in the completion of the Redwood Highway, which is a vision of the people of Grants Pass, and

WHEREAS, during all the years of the expenditures of said sums of money and said efforts, a county court of Jackson county and other citizens of Medford, Oregon, have come into the boundaries of Josephine county, Oregon, and have held meetings at Medford, Oregon, and in Williams valley in this county for the purpose of dividing the sentiment of the people of this district for funds for the construction of a road parallel to the Redwood highway and have alienated a portion of the agricultural trade belonging to this city, because of reports circulated by them.
