MONTREAL, Aug. 22.—(AP) Mrs. Mary-Vivian, 43-year-old mother of eight children, today was in the jail at Hull, Que., where she will be brought tomorrow for the murder of her husband. She collapsed yesterday, when she was removed to Hull from the Fullum street jail for women where she had been confined for three months awaiting execution.

Phillibert Lefebvre, convicted with Mrs. Vivian as her partner in the crime, was in the same jail, also sentenced to death.

MIAMI, Fla., Aug. 22.—(AP) Construction work on a proposed \$10,000,000 millionaire's colony, described by contractors as one of the most elaborate projects of its kind ever attempted, will be started here Sept. 3, Julien Southerland Miami attorney and representative for investors announced today.
