PEAR CAMPAIGN DONORS LISTED BY COMMITTEE

Hope to Have Response From All Orchardists in Valley — Generous Co- operation Reported—Will Open New Markets.

The Winter Pear committee yesterday completed compilation of a list of the orchardists who have subscribed to the Rose Pear campaign, and the winter pear campaign fund.

The major objects of the campaign are to open new markets for Rose and winter pear varieties, and scientific study of marketing and storage conditions, and the working out of a plan whereby the winter varieties can be marketed in larger quantities, and in the maximum palatable condition.

Despite a generous response, there are many orchard owners who are not on the list, and the committee would appreciate it if any orchard, overlooked through error, failure of the solicitors to call upon them, or for any other reason would call them, if they desire to subscribe.

A revised list of the subscribers will be published at an early date when it is hoped to have the names of every orchard in the valley as a subscriber.

The work, as outlined by the winter pear committee, is widespread in its scope, and will result, when completed, in better pear marketing and advertising. The committee is meeting two and three times a week, under the chairmanship of David R. Wood, threshing out the details.

The committee desires all orchardists who have subscribed, but are not listed, to phone them as soon as convenient.

PARASITES KILL ELK LAKE FISH

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 22.—(AP) Its shores strewn with dead fish as the result of an outbreak by parasite worms, Elk Lake near Bend, one of the most popular fishing centers in the state, was closed yesterday by combined order of the state game commission, the United States bureau of hatcheries and the state board of health.

Several persons were reported to have been taken seriously ill after eating fish caught in the lake before the epidemic set in.

Officials of the game commission said they had never heard of parasite worms attacking fish in northern waters. They declared the worm is not uncommon in the tropics.

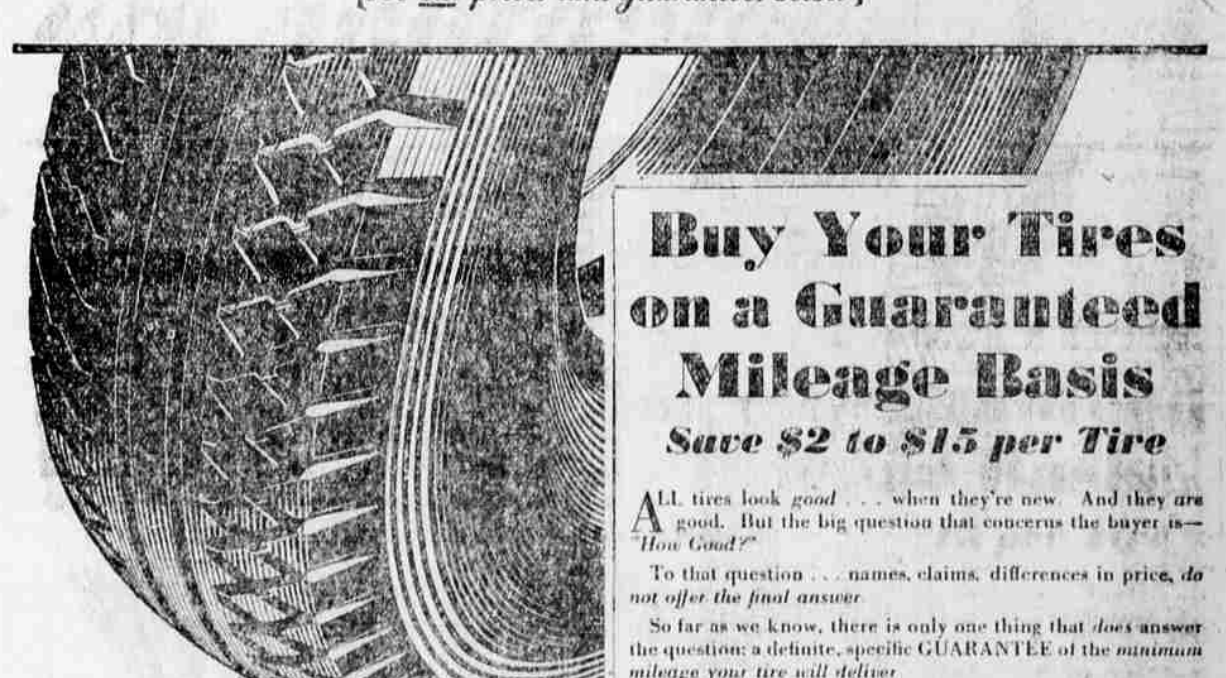
