

NEWBURY STORE OPENS DOORS ON SATURDAY MORN

A new link in the chain of 200 merchandising establishments, and the latest addition to Medford's business district, the J. J. Newbury company store, will open its doors to the local buying public at nine o'clock tomorrow morning. The new five- and 25-cent store, the values of which, in reality range up to one dollar, is located on North Central in the building formerly occupied by Rosenberg Bros.

Items, including wearing apparel, household specialties, stationery, drug items, toiletries, notions, photographic records, notions and hardware. The first store in the chain of 200 establishments was located at 87 Broadway, Pa. in 1912. From there the branches spread to other cities throughout the east and middle west. The J. J. Newbury company has been on the Pacific coast but three years, completing its effort to coast chain with the purchase of the former RUI store in the northwest at that time.

The local store was purchased from the Rosenberg Brothers five to six weeks after which a program of remodeling and renovation was commenced. The aisles of the store were widened to aid in the comfort of the purchasers and to facilitate traffic within the store, and a complete new line of up-to-date fixtures and equipment were installed.

The opening sale tomorrow, during which a number of articles will be offered at cost, according

to the management will be under the direction of F. E. Steele, formerly of Los Angeles, who has been appointed manager of the local store. Mr. Steele, who has created here permanently with Mrs. Steele, at their home, 19 1/2 New Street, expressed enthusiasm over his future association with the Medford merchants and citizens over the future of the Rogue River valley.

A staff of 75 girls will assist during the opening sale, this number gradually being reduced to 15 or 20 regular clerks. Mr. Steele will be assisted in the management by Earl Shaw of Portland, formerly with the parent stores.

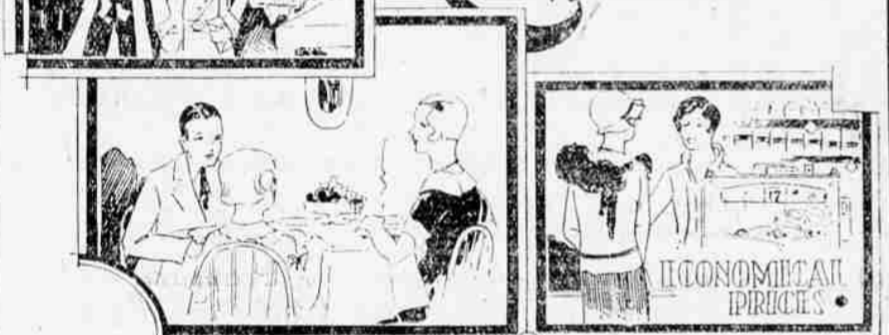
