

STOCKS MOVE UP TO NEW RECORDS IN BULL RAMPAGE

NEW YORK, Aug. 23.—(AP) The stock market went forth on another wild "bull" rampage today in the face of a record breaking increase in federal reserve brokers' loans. Thirty or more stocks were whipped up 2 to 17 points to new high records, the list including several representative steel, oil, railroad, and public utility shares. Trading was in fairly heavy volume, several blocks of 5000 to 25,000 shares changing hands, particularly in the oil group.

Communications issues took the lead in the afternoon, although U. S. Steel continued into new high ground, touching 246. International Telephone & Telegraph rose 8 points, Western Union 7 1/2, American Telephone & Telegraph 5, and Radio 4. In addition, Columbian Carbon jumped 13 1/2, Youngtown Sheet & Tube 9, and A. M. Byers 7. Case Threading Machine, which had risen 6 points to 325, took a sudden fall to 325. The closing tone was strong. Total sales approximated 4,900,000 shares.
