

### SOVIET AVIATORS AGAIN ESSAY HOP VIA NORTH ROUTE

MOSCOW, Aug. 23.—(AP) Senyon Shestakov, Russian aviator who crashed near Siberia on an attempted Moscow to New York flight, left here at 3 a. m. (8 p. m. E. S. T. Thursday) on a new attempt to reach America by the same route. He planned several stops, the first possibly at Krasnoyarsk, 2000 miles away.

His new plane, like that he crashed on at Chita after crossing most of Asia, was called the "Land of the Soviets." It has two engines of 1200 horsepower, similar to the engines of the former plane.

The aviator said if his flight was successful it was proposed to establish in 1931 an airline between Russia and the American west coast as a continuation of the trans-Siberian service.

The first Land of the Soviets crashed in the wilds of Siberia near Chita on August 8, the plane being considerably damaged but its crew escaping injury.

### ASHLAND WATERSHED PROTECTION AGREED TO BY GOVERNMENT

ASHLAND, Ore., Aug. 23.—(Special)—Final adjustment has been reached between the city of Ashland and the United States Department of Agriculture, forestry department, whereby the city water supply will be protected from possible damage from the sale of timber on the watershed. By unanimous decision the city council voted on Tuesday evening to empower the mayor, J. Howard Thornton to sign the agreement that was presented by the district forester, G. M. Granger of Portland. The agreement gives the city practically all the protection sought and includes the protection of the lands adjacent to the watershed.

### MOLLA BOWS TO QUEEN OF COURT

FOREST HILLS, N. Y., Aug. 23.—(AP)—Crushing her old rival, Mrs. Molla Mallory, in two love sets, this afternoon, Helen Wills reached the final round of the national women's tennis championship tournament where tomorrow she will defend her title against Mrs. Phoebe Watson, English star. After Mrs. Watson had downed Helen Jacobs, America's second ranking star, in a hard fought three-set match, Queen Helen proceeded to give one of the most impressive exhibitions of nearly perfect tennis ever seen on the West Side stadium turf as she swept aside her one time rival in a one-sided match that lasted just 22 minutes.

NEWPORT, R. I., Aug. 23.—(AP) Playing inspired tennis, George M. Lott, Jr., of Chicago, and Johnny Doe, Sr. of Monica, Cal., the defending doubles champions in the Newport Casino invitation tournament, today gained the final round by routing Bill Tilden and Frank Hunter, 6-4, 6-2.
