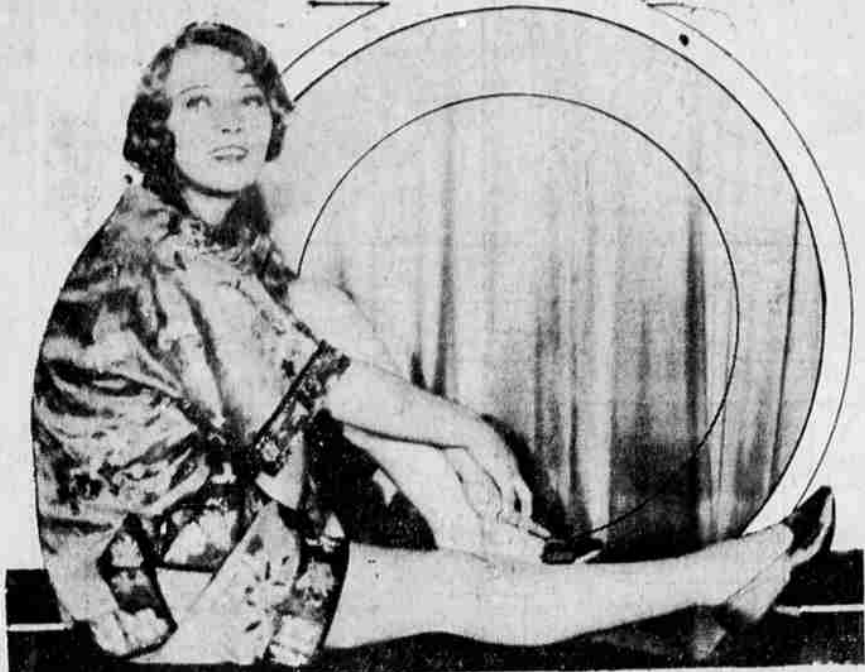
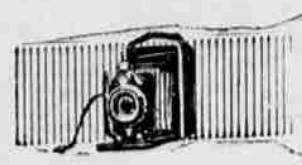


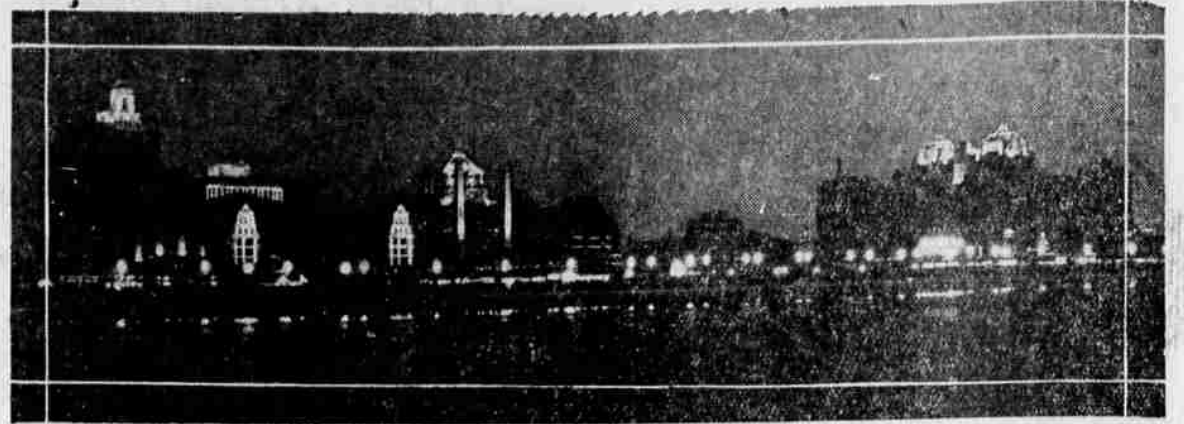
# CAMERAGRAMS

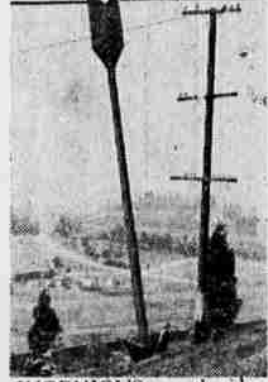
KEEPING COOL? Well, this isn't the way to do it these summer days. James Hall, however, was forced to wear this costume for a movie production in Hollywood.

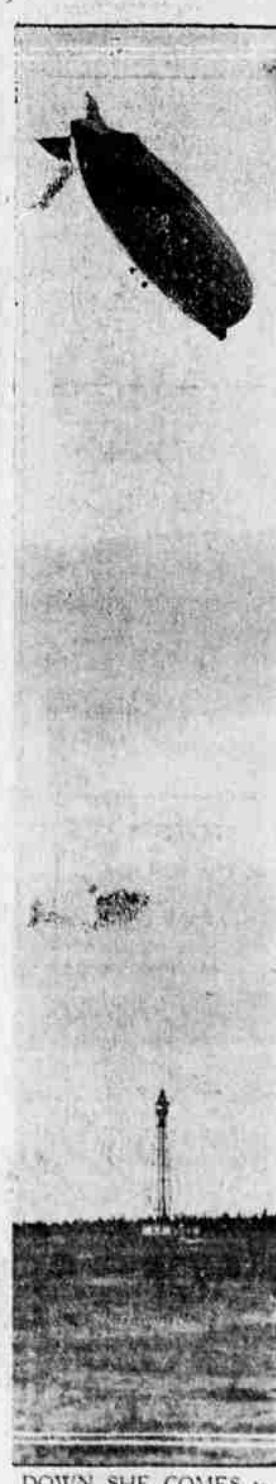

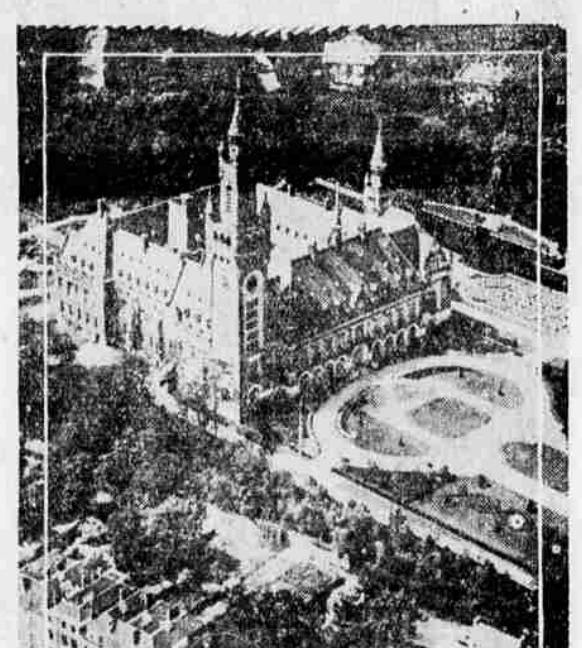

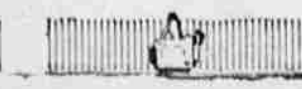
