

# IRRIGATION FOR TWO SURVIVORS SOME DISTRICTS LAST MAN CLUB IS INSUFFICIENT CIVIL WAR VETS

### Crop Conditions Show Lack of Water—Range Stock Also Suffering in Long-Continued Drought—Rain On Coast.

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 28.—(AP) The United States department of agriculture, weather bureau, in a summary of weather and crop conditions for the state, week ending August 27, states that water for irrigation is insufficient in some localities and that there is still some shortage of water for range stock.

"There was considerable cloudiness," the report stated, "and rain fell in the northwest section and along the entire coast."

The report continued: "Cereals: Harvest and threshing of winter wheat are practically complete in the more advanced sections, and much spring wheat has been cut and threshed. In the most elevated districts harvest will continue for some time. Irrigated corn is maturing well, and the same is true of some well cultivated fields in unirrigated sections.

Fruit: Peaches, Bartlett pears and prunes are being picked and shipped, and some early apples are on the market. There is a heavy drop of prunes in some localities. Apples are doing well, but some sunburn is reported.

Meadows, pastures and ranges: Except late sections of alfalfa, most hay has been cut and stacked, and much haying has been done. Hains have benefited pastures locally, but most domestic pastures are still very dry and short, and range feed is becoming dry in most places.

Livestock: Stock is showing some effect of short pasturage, and many heads of cattle are being shipped in good condition.

Miscellaneous: The potato crop has been materially injured by lack of moisture. Watermelons and cantaloupes are being marketed in quantities, and tomatoes are plentiful and of good quality.

### Death Takes John Goff, Youngest of Trio Which Has Carried On for Past Two Years—34 Members at First Meeting.

ST. PAUL, Minn., Aug. 28.—(AP) Death has checked another name from the membership roll of the Last Man's club. Today only two members survive.

John Goff, 88, of St. Paul, youngest of the trio who for two years have kept the famous organization of Civil War veterans in existence, died yesterday at the Veterans' hospital at Fort Snelling. He was 86 years old.

It was at Stillwater, Minn., July 21, 1885, that 34 members of B Company, First Minnesota regiment, which fought in the battle of Bull Run, pledged themselves to a comradeship which only death could dissolve. One by one the ranks have been emptied until today only Peter O. Hall, 91, of Atwater, Minn., and Charles Lockwood, 89, of Chamberlain, S. D., remain. They are expected to attend the funeral of their comrade at Stillwater Friday.

At the first meeting of the club in 1885 a bottle of wine was set aside. It was to be opened by the last man who was to drink a toast to those who had come before. Two years ago, however, the three survivors opened the wine, the three of them drank the toast. They decided that it would be too great an ordeal for one man alone.

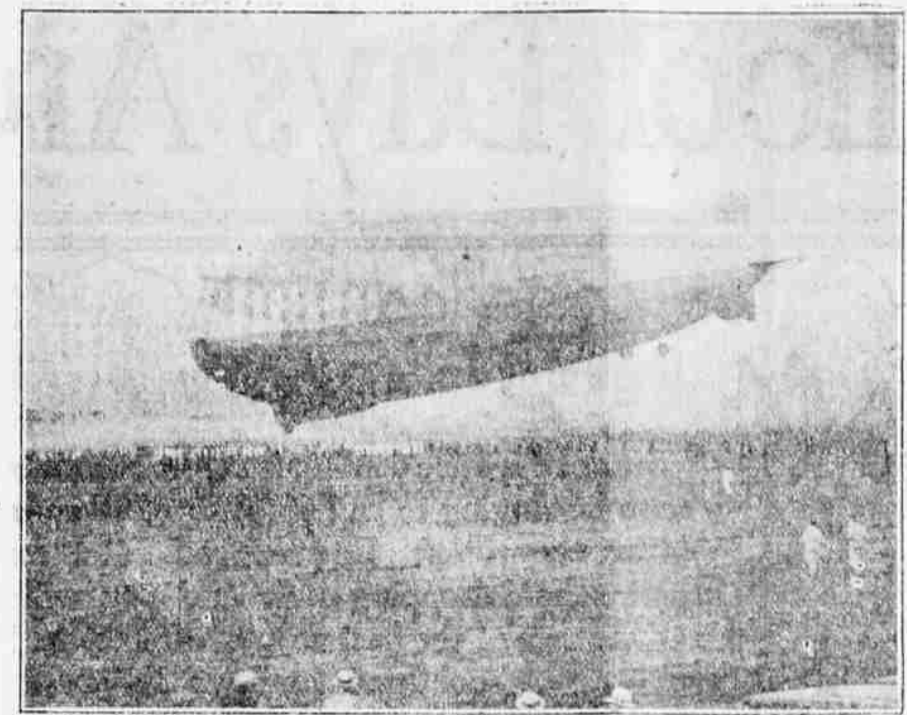
### OLD AGE PENSION FOR OREGON IS UNION AIM

TILLOMOOK, Ore., Aug. 28.—(AP) An old age pension law for Oregon will be sought by the Oregon State Federation of Labor at the next legislative session, according to a resolution adopted by the organization at the annual convention here today.

### GIANT DIRIGIBLE COMES TO EARTH AT LOS ANGELES

Arrival in Los Angeles marked the end of the next to last leg of around-the-world flight, which started from Lakehurst on August 7. She was to sail for Lakehurst to complete the circling of the globe after returning.

### DARING ROBBERY IN PHILADELPHIA CONFESSED FAKE

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 28.—(AP) Director Laurence R. Schofield of the department of public safety, announced today that the "daring city hall holdup and payroll robbery" yesterday was a fake, staged purely to cover up alleged embezzlements of Alexander Hamilton, assistant paymaster of the department of public works, who told of being waylaid at pistol point. Hamilton was said to have confessed.

The director stated that the \$4000 which figured in the case had been recovered. He said that Hamilton and two other men had been arrested on charges of burglary, conspiracy, and receiving stolen goods.

Hamilton is 44, and has been employed in the public works department for 18 years. His salary is \$1800 a year.

NEW YORK, Aug. 28.—(AP) The stock market apparently recovered from its rocky start today when aggressive bullish demonstrations were conducted in the cash and specialties. Little progress was made by such groups as the oil, rubber, steel and copper, and there were few signs of weakness. Most operations profited the backround for the advance, although several of the large commission houses reported an increasing odd lot business from small traders and investors.

The market succumbed to a wave of profit taking and short selling in the last hour under which many high priced shares dropped from 2 to a point below their best figures. American Calt International Telephone and Telegraph, and Montgomery Ward were heavy. Copper also were sold liberally. The close was irregular. Total sales approximated 1,000,000 shares.
