FLOUNCE ROCK VISITORS TO SEE CRATER LAKE

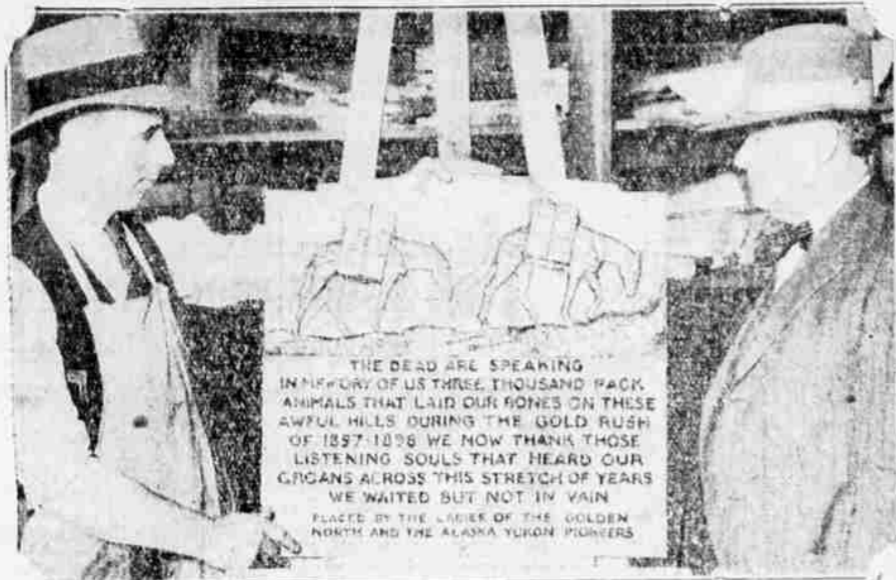

THE PAS, Man., Aug. 28.—(AP)—Reports of a rich mineral strike in northern Saskatchewan reached here today. Mining corporations and independent prospectors started a rush for the Montgomery Lake area, about 200 miles north of Prince Albert, to stake out claims.

The discovery is said to be a formation containing copper, nickel, gold, zinc, lead and platinum values. About 50 claims have been recorded so far.
