JACKSONVILLE RELICS TOURIST ATTRACTION

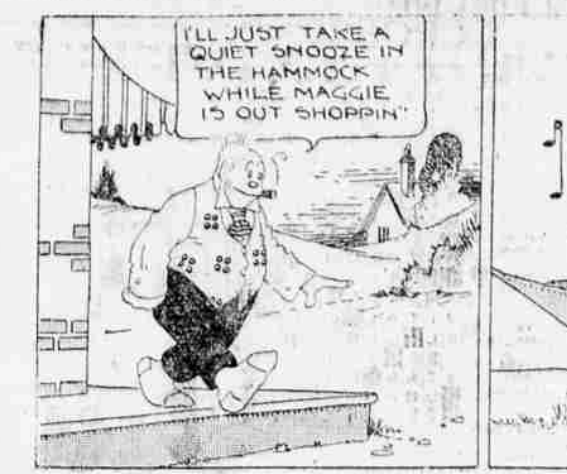

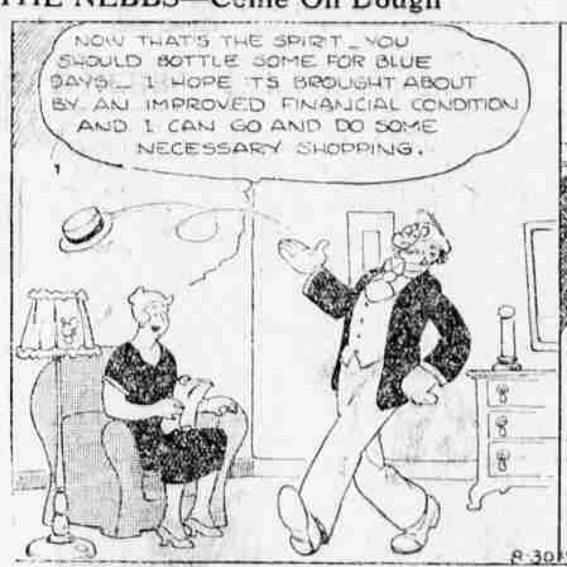

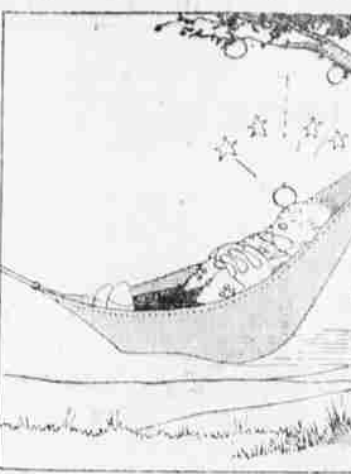
