

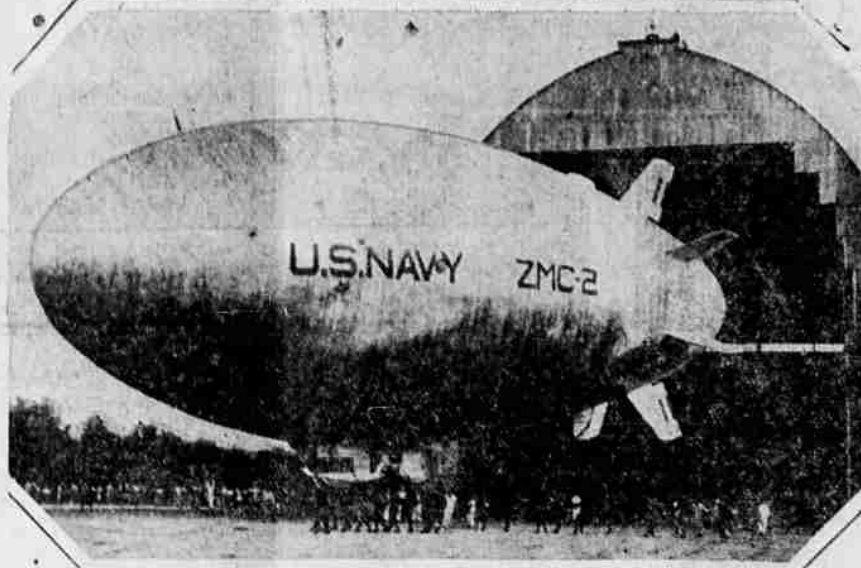

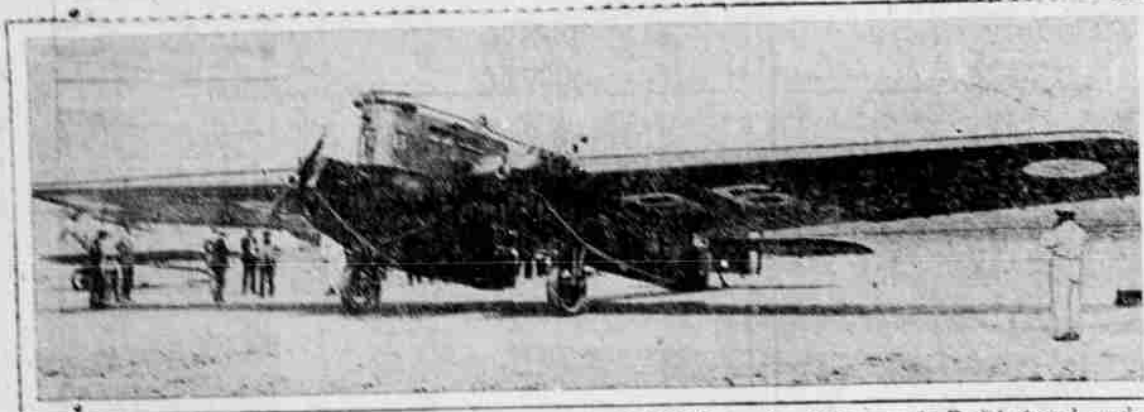

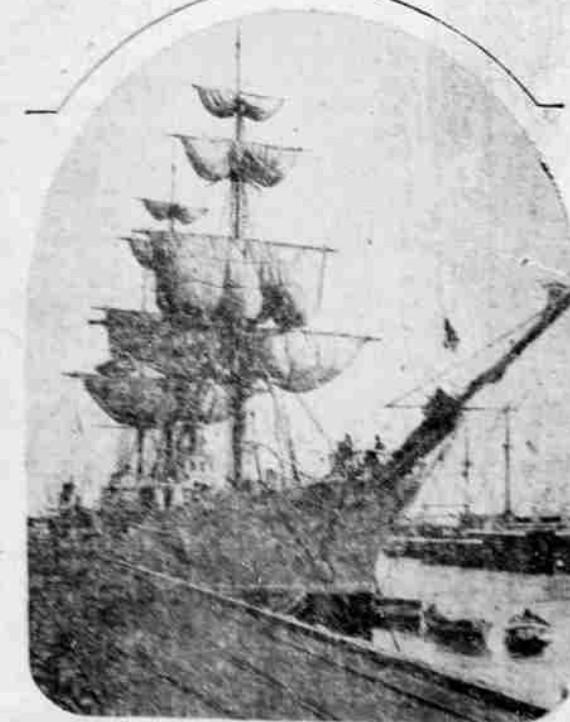
CALM AND RESTFUL AND PLEASANT seems St. Mary's lake in Glacier National Park, Montana. It is one of the show places of the huge national playground.
