

OBJECTIONS TO TARIFF ARE VOICED

Senate Minority Leader Points Out Nine Outstanding Objections to Pending Measure — Farmer Is Chief Concern of Democratic Spokesman—Held Inconsistent.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 12.—(AP)—Nine "outstanding objections" to the pending tariff bill were enumerated in a speech in the senate by Senator Simmons, of North Carolina, who opened fire on the Republican measure for the Democrats by declaring it would add billions of dollars to the annual tax burden imposed upon the consuming masses.

Among his castigation not only of the administrative and special features of the bill but of proposed increased rates on wool, the woolen tariff leader gave the following reason why he could not support it.

"It contains many rates and increases upon agricultural products that are useless and ineffective.

"It is replete with prohibitive rates on articles which farmers buy.

"It contains numerous instances of higher rates on articles used by the masses than on articles of identical use, but purchased principally by persons of wealth or of more than average means.

"It does not conform to President Hoover's request for increases on industrial products only when there has been a slackening of employment due to imports. In many cases increases have been granted to industries which have been very prosperous under the present tariff act.

Held Inconsistent
"It is full of inconsistencies and unfair discriminations.

"It increases rates on many articles even though the imports under the present tariff act have been negligible.

"It encourages inefficiency by many of its increases in rates.

"Its excessive increases on many articles imperil our trade with European countries.

"By its liberalization of the flexible provisions, enlarging the scope and discretion of the president, the latitude allowed the president in the imposition of additional duties is dangerously expanded."

Declaring the amendments to the present law made by the house and those proposed by the finance committee majority were not fixed upon a basis of the difference in cost of production here and abroad but were determined "largely in response to the appeals and demands of the beneficiaries of the high and excessive rates" proposed, the North Carolina senator challenged the contention of the majority that the cost of production measuring rod was no longer practicable of application.

FRENCH CASINOS TAKE HUGE SUMS FROM BRITISHERS

PARIS—(AP)—Gambling fever has British holiday makers in its grip, and the gamblers are pouring their shillings and pounds into France in almost enough volume to pay the French war debt to Britain.

Within a few hours' travel of southern England, including London, there are dozens of French seaside resorts, and all these resorts have casinos. Le Touquet, Deauville, Trouville and Dinard, are the chief ones, but there are scores of smaller ones striding the Emerald Coast. The Le Touquet casino alone made \$2,000,000 last year, and the French government collected more than that in taxes.

British consuls are kept busy sending the losers back to England. Belgium has now added to the facilities for the British trippers' money by making roulette legal in all Belgian casinos. Roulette has hitherto been more or less confined to Monte Carlo.

There seems to be not the slightest chance of a reform which striking France and giving the prohibition of gambling, which has passed periodically before the war. The reason is that the government makes millions from gambling by taxation, and the government needs the money badly.

Mail Plane Crashes
ATLANTA, Ga., Sept. 12.—(AP)—The air mail plane from New York to Atlanta crashed into a radio tower at Fort McPherson early today in a fog, fatally injuring the pilot, Sid Molloy, of Columbus, Miss. He died at the Fort McPherson hospital, where he had been taken by soldiers who pulled him from the wreckage of the plane.
