

LOVE OPPOSED; INDIAN MAIDEN KILLS MOTHER

Reservation Girl Confesses Altercation Over Relations With Ex-Convict Led to Deed—Body Was Hidden in Brush.

NORTHPORT, Wash., Sept. 15.—(AP)—A 20-year-old Corvallis Indian girl today was in jail accused of murder because she refused to give up the man she loved.

Helen Moses, who lived on the reservation near here, confessed to Prosecuting Attorney Thomas Oakshot, that officer said, that she killed her mother Mrs. Susie Moses with a .22 calibre rifle during an altercation Tuesday night which resulted from her parents' objection to a relationship with Clarence Hartley, who had served two terms in the state reformatory.

After shooting her mother, the officer said Helen told him, the girl and Hartley hid the body in some brush near her home and then reported that Mrs. Moses had been killed, probably by a burglar. An investigation by Prosecutor Oakshot yesterday was followed by the announcement that Mrs. Moses probably had been killed by a burglar surprised when she returned from a neighbor's home.

Last night while Helen was being questioned, Oakshot said, she suddenly admitted the crime and then made a complete confession. A warrant was issued for the arrest of Hartley, who had served two terms in the state reformatory at Monroe on grand larceny and forgery charges.

ANXIETY FELT FOR WINIFRED GAYLORD ABSENT ATTORNEY

Aid of the sheriff's office has been sought by friends and relatives to locate Winfield R. Gaylord, local attorney, who left August 9 to attend to business matters in San Francisco and has been missing ever since.

A postcard was received by relatives here and it bore a Los Angeles postmark, but nothing further has been heard. The sheriff's office has sent telegrams to California authorities in an effort to locate the attorney, but so far the efforts have been unsuccessful. He is said to have left Medford to attend to a matter in federal court in San Francisco, leaving here by stage.

While it is believed word from Gaylord will soon be received, his silence being attributed to press of business matters and traveling about, his family and many friends are naturally considerably worried.

DRESS RULE IRKS FILIPINO STUDENT

MANILA—(AP)—Almost all of the students at the University of the Philippines are protesting against a law which requires that they attend school attired in inexpensive white cotton clothing, but only one student, Miss Rosario Sison, has been exempted from the provisions of the statute. She won exemption because of a religious vow.

Miss Sison related that she made a vow to Our Lady of Carmel that she would forego dances, parties, filmy dresses and flowing skirts and that she would wear the robe of the Carmel devotees. Dean Benitez of the university thereupon permitted her to attend classes in a brown robe. Much controversy has resulted from enforcement of the regulations, which have been in force a little more than a year. Recently 2000 students signed a petition to the house of representatives urging that the law be repealed.

EGYPTIANS USED COIN IN 1700 BC

BERLIN—(AP)—Recent investigations have shown that the Egyptians had a regular monetary system a thousand years before the first Greek coins were struck seven centuries B. C., according to Professor Baron Friedrich W. von Driessing, eminent Egyptianologist, writing in the scientific journal, Research and Progress.

This Egyptian money was called "shek" and served as a standard in determining the value of food, clothing or payments made in kind for work done. Two shek was a laborer's daily wage. The ratio of value for the same weight was: Gold 12, silver 6, and lead 3 shek. Daily stamped gold rings represented the coinage standards. This money fell into disuse in the Middle Kingdom period, centuries before Tut-Ankh-Amen's time, when the Egyptians reverted to primitive barter, owing to the less scientific, but more commercially astute trading methods of the Phoenicians.

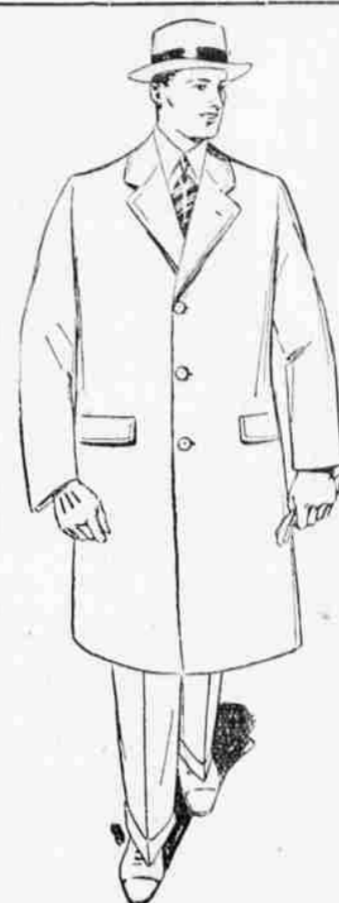
