SALEM, Ore., Sept. 24.—(P)—Three Coos county boys will go to summer school at Oregon State College next year on free scholarships given by the state fair board...

The other county club teams placing were: Second place, Tillamook, scoring 2178; third, Lane county, 2169; Umatilla, 2156; fifth, Lane, 2155. Cash prizes were awarded these teams in the respective amounts of \$25, \$20, \$18, and \$12.

The members of the latter four teams and their individual scores were: Tillamook, Karl Zweifel, 752; Walter Naegeli, 680; Robert Williams, 746; Lynn Northrup Bates, 713; Lloyd Schaffer, 710; Otto Neymeyer, 746; Umatilla, Dick Martin, 718; Donald Demoss, 724; Enos Martin, 714; Lane, Marion Kelso, 738; Glenn Harwood, 658; Warner Zumalt, 759.

It so happened that the Lane county team, lowest of the five that placed, had the member who made the highest individual score. This was Warner Zumalt. His scores that made his total of 759 were placing scores of Jerseys 85, Guernseys 190, Shorthorn heifers 85, fat steers 85, Shropshires 100, Cotswolds 85, Poland Chinas 55, Durocs 70, and a "reasons" score of 94 on Jerseys.

A new event for the club workers this year was a crops judging contest by four county teams placing four classes each on oats, wheat, barley, corn, potatoes, beets, cabbage and hay and graded a sack of field run potatoes. The Tillamook team, composed of Carl Benschmidt, Leo Sander and Edward Plasker won first prize...

The Washington county team, John Strickler, Donald Eddy and Donald Smiltzer, was second, winning a cash prize of \$12. The Lane county team, Oral Cotton, Harry Adair and Frederick Fox, was third, winning a cash prize of \$9.
