

CROP DATA SHOWS FROSTS CUT YIELD OF OREGON FIELDS

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 26.—(AP) The final weekly weather and crop report, issued by the United States Department of Agriculture here, says frost occurred in scattered places throughout the state during one week and that it was generally cool and cloudy.

The detailed crop report follows: Cereals: A little seeding has been done, but the soil is still too dry for general seeding. Some late corn was injured by frost. Corn cutting is in progress.

Fruits: Ripening of prunes was delayed by the smoke cover, and later was somewhat delayed by cloudy, rainy weather in northwest counties. Prune drying is general. In Douglas county Italian and Petite prunes are ripening at the same time, due to abnormal weather conditions, making harvest very difficult. Some winter pears are being shipped.

Meadows, pastures, and ranges: Hains have been of slight help to pastures in northwest counties, but have been of little help in any sections. Hay is about over for the year.

Livestock: Stock continues to show the effect of dry, short pastures. Much feeding is being done.

Miscellaneous: Late potatoes have been much injured by the drought, and in some places have been cut down by frost. Melons and tomatoes, where not protected were considerably injured by frost.

BUTTER PRICES HOLD FIRM PORTLAND MART

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 26.—(AP) The butter market was firm at prices previously established by the Portland Produce exchange. The Pacific Coast Butter Producers' still quote fresh extras at 44 cents to wholesalers and 42 cents to retailers.

The first Jonathan apples were being offered at \$2.75 and \$3.25 per box for fancy wrapped stock at a box.

Good tomatoes have advanced to 50 cents a box.

East Side market prices were steady and unchanged.

NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—(AP)—The stock market, which was in a state of despair bordering on panic yesterday, regained its poise today when it became apparent that there was no foundation for the many wild rumors of a devaluation and prices rallied briskly under the heavy buying for both accounts. Extreme gains in the active issues ran from 1 to 19 points, with a few high priced specialties marked up 12 to 29 points.

The advance in public utility shares were largely extended in the closing hour. Standard Oil and Electric touched 216 1/2, a jump of 16 points to a new high. National Biscuit was up 12, Commercial Solvents 13 1/2, Underwood Elliott Fisher & Philadelphia Company 6 1/2 and American Telephone 7. Meanwhile, Adams Express ran off further to 6 1/2, and Marmion Motors slid down 5 1/2 to 58, new low for the year. The closing was strong. Sales approximated 4,000,000 shares.
