WINTER NELLS HARVEST WILL OPEN MONDAY

Crop Estimated at 225 Cars
—Total Pear Production Will Be 80 Per Cent. Is Report at Traffic Association Meet.

Picking and packing of Winter Nells pears will start next Monday, it was announced this noon at the regular meeting of the Rogue River Traffic association.

It was estimated that the Winter Nells crop would total 225 cars. The spring estimate was 235 cars. Last year 267 cars of Winter Nells were shipped.

A report was also read showing that the 1929 pear crop would be 80 per cent of last year's crop, which was the spring estimate.

It was also reported that the general picking and packing of the Newtown apples would start next week. In the Gold Hill district the picking of Newtown apples is already under way.

There has been a decrease in fruit shipments the past week and up to noon today, but 65 cars are listed for shipment today. Many of the packing houses have ceased full-time operations, while others are continuing full blast.

It is estimated that between 350 and 400 cars of pears are held in storage. They are all Rose and Comice, with a few Howells.

The board of directors of the Placerville fruit association visited the city and valley yesterday, inspecting local orchards and packing plants.

The traffic meeting was a short affair, with a light attendance, the members being anxious to get to their desks, as President David Rosenberg adjourned quickly.

JACKSON COUNTY HAS PRIZE CORN

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 25.—(AP)—Jackson county took first, second and third places at the state fair in the corn exhibit of the 4-H clubs for eastern and southern Oregon, and for the western Oregon counties Marion was first, Clackamas second and Marion took the other three places.

NIGHT FLIGHTS IN DECEMBER IS WORD TO COPCO

J. P. Worthington, Portland, connected with the aviation department of the department of commerce, here today on a tour of inspection, informed J. C. Thompson, district manager of the California Oregon Power company that it was the expectation to start night flying on the Seattle-San Francisco airway early in December.

Worthington said that the work of installing the beacon lights between Delta, Calif., and Drain, Ore., would start at once. The contract for the installation is held by a Salt Lake City, Utah firm and the government has urged speed.

The work of installing the power lines to the beacon sites has been completed by the California Oregon Power company in all mountainous sections of the Drain-Delta unit, and the work is 90 per cent completed on the remainder of the contract.

It is understood that the schedules for the night-flying planes are now being prepared.

DENIES SHIPYARDS PAID FOR LOBBY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25.—(AP)—The \$143,000 fund expended by American shipbuilders during the congressional consideration of the Jones-White merchant marine legislation was not used for "lobbying" Lawrence E. Wilder, shipping executive, testified today before a senate naval sub-committee.

Wilder, former president of the American Brown Boveri Electric Corporation, took the witness chair today as the committee resumed its inquiry into the activities of American shipbuilders and their observer and reporter, William B. Shearer, at the unsuccessful 1927 Geneva naval limitations conference.

BROOKHART READS ACCUSING REPORT

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25.—(AP)—Senator Brookhart, Republican, Iowa, read before the senate agriculture committee today what he said was testimony in the Ford libel suit, in which a witness accused James C. Stone, now vice chairman of the federal farm board, of selling his warehouse, purchased for \$165,000 in 1926, to the Burley Tobacco Growers association, of which he was president, for \$225,000 in 1921.

The witness in the libel suit, who Brookhart said was named Buckley, was quoted by the senator as testifying that Stone had urged him (Buckley) to help organize the cooperative because they would both get good positions at good salaries.

RUSSIAN AVIATORS HELD BY WEATHER

DUTCH HARBOR, Unalaska, Sept. 25.—(AP)—Unfavorable weather today again forced the four Russian aviators, flying from Moscow to New York in the "Land of the Soviets" to postpone their start for Seward on the mainland of Alaska.

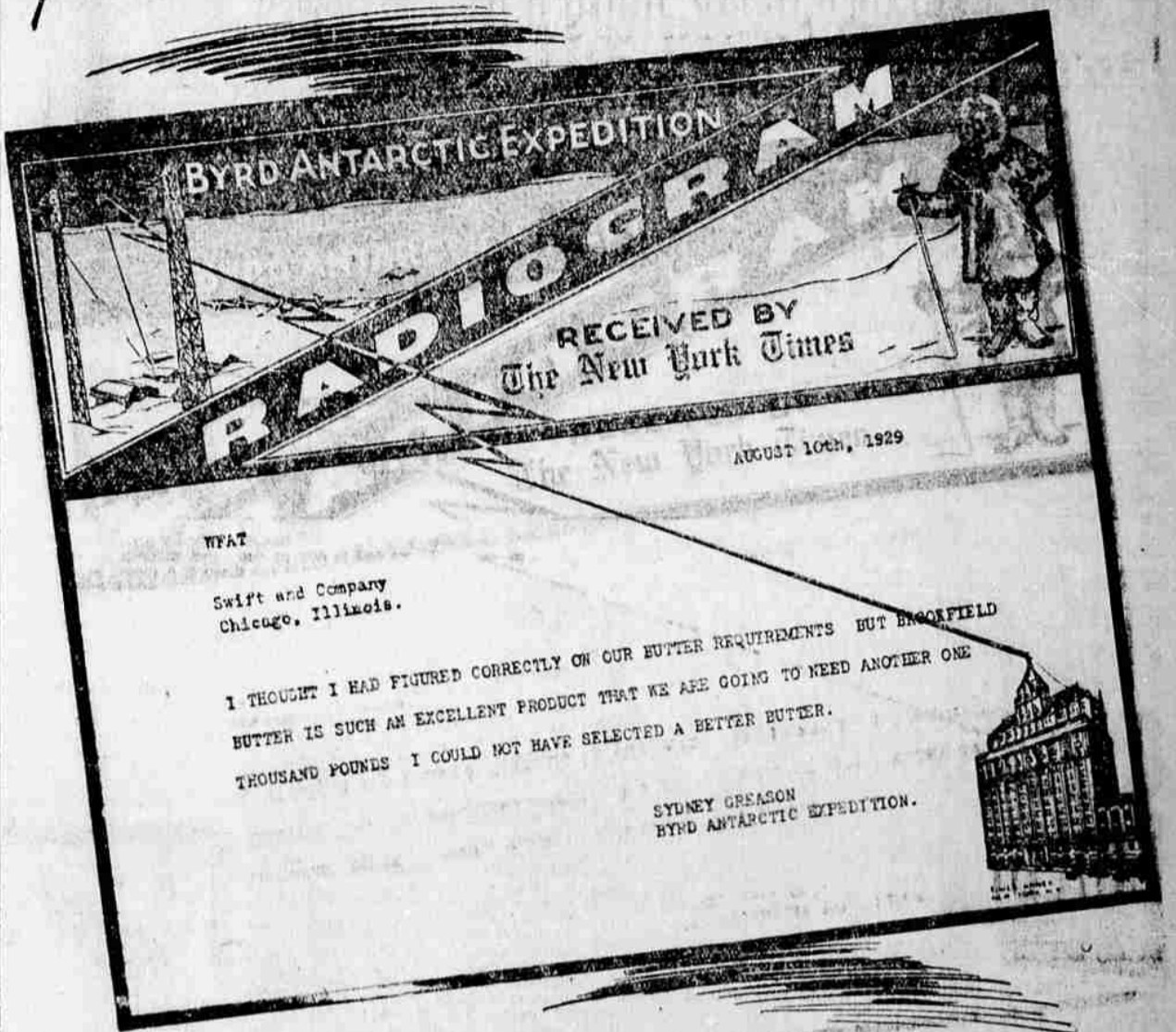
