LOCAL STUDENTS WIN 'U' LAURELS

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Sept. 30.—(Special.)—Harold N. Risk, Margaret Turner and John S. Hamill of Medford have been named honor students at the University of Oregon by the honors council. A total of 291 students comprising the 30 per cent who hold the highest scholastic records, were selected as honor students and were awarded honors privileges. Honors privileges, if the student takes advantage of them, allow him to enroll in honors courses, enable him to come in closer contact with his professors and permit him to do individual work. He is exempt from much of the routine work of classes and is given intensive and highly specialized work to do. A student may enroll in general honors, which means that he may do honors work in three courses, or he may choose to do it only in one course.

Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, Sept. 30.—(P)—Liquidation of stocks was resumed on a broad scale in today's stock market after another unsuccessful attempt to bring about a general rally in the early trading. Scores of issues broke 3 to 10 points and Auburn Auto broke 18 to 401, or just 114 points below the recent high. Trading was in fairly heavy volume. Call money advanced from 9 to 10 per cent as banks called loans in preparation for month-end settlements. Buying orders steadied the list somewhat in the final hour. Columbia Carbon gaining 10 points above Saturday's close. A. M. Myers was up 8 points. Beatrice Creamery 7, and Houston Oil and Mexican Steels up 5 1/2 each. Auburn Auto recovered half of its 38 point break. The closing tone was steady. Total sales approximated 4,200,000 shares.
