

APPLES FIND READY SALES IN PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 4.—(AP) Butter and egg supplies were moderate on the market today with prices unchanged.

Francis boxed Jonathans and Delicious apples from the Ewe-water and Yakima districts find ready sale at \$3.50 and \$3.75 a box. The prompt sales were attributed to the extensive advertising campaign instituted by northwestern boxed apple interests.

The cantaloupe supply continued to fade. The best Dillard stock is held at \$3 per crate of standard size.

Receipts of Concord grapes were increasing, but sales are somewhat slow at 2-3 to 3 1/2 cents a pound. The vegetable market was unchanged.

CALIFORNIAN SETS SOLO AIR RECORD

LONG BEACH, Calif., Oct. 4.—(AP)—Vern Speck, physically fit and "not very tired," after 38 hours, 48 seconds aloft alone, today was the holder of the world's solo endurance non-refueling airplane flight record.

Speck had broken down upon Long Beach municipal airport at 8:27:03 p. m. yesterday. He had taken off from the same field at 6:28:15 a. m. Tuesday.

Although solo endurance marks are not among the major records recognized by the National Aeronautical association, Joseph Nikrent, National Aeronautics association timer, officially certified that Speck had broken the former record of 36 hours, 55 minutes, held by Lieutenant Herbert J. Paby of Los Angeles.
