

OLD UNIFORMS OF CAPITAL BUGLERS CAUSE OF DEFEAT

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 8.—(AP)—If the drum corps of Capital post No. 9, the drill and musical organization at Louisville, Ky., with new uniforms and better equipment, it would have won the national championship. This was indicated when the corps returned home and showed the standings of the five leading corps as they were scored by three judges from the United States regular army.

The Salem corps, the scores show, lost 1.3 points on uniform and equipment and lost first place by only 1.2, and there was less than two points between Frankfort, Pa., the winning corps, and the Salem contingent, which was accorded fifth place.

On cadence place, the scores were perfect, and on music it was 59.6 out of a possible 40. Old uniforms, with hoods that wrinkled at the ankles and hats that didn't fit, put Salem in fifth place instead of first.

A crowd of perhaps 1000 persons greeted the Salem corps upon their arrival here yesterday. The corps was lined up and paraded through the streets and to the Elks temple where a banquet was served. Governor Patterson and Secretary of State Hal E. Ross were at the banquet.

GABRIELSON TO STUDY AUTO RESPONSIBILITY

WOMAN BEQUEATHS \$25,000 TO FRIEND

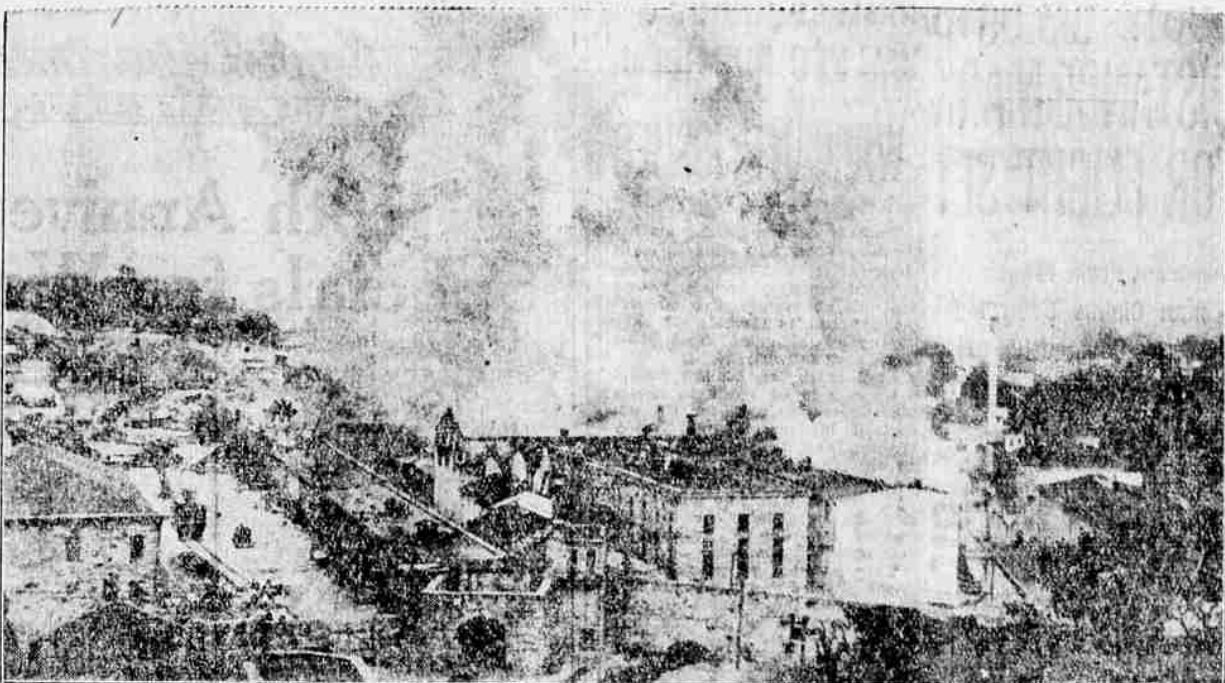

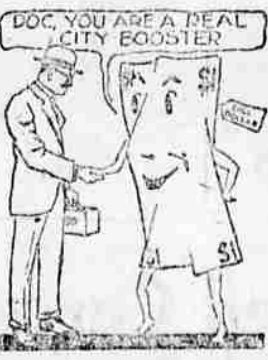
