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## WOMEN GOING IN FOR PISCATORIAL SPORT ON ROGUE

"Women are taking to the sport of fishing like the fish do to water," said Ralph Cowgill, state game commission engineer, who was the principal speaker before the Business and Professional Women's club at their regular Thursday noon luncheon at the Hotel Holland today. Mr. Cowgill said that Rogue river fishing was growing in popularity and drawing both men and women of note to the Rogue River valley from various sections of the world as well as from the remote corners of this country.

While there is a depletion of fish in Rogue river and the streams surrounding Medford, due to poaching and excessive activities of some individual and commercial concerns, according to Mr. Cowgill, the commission now has the situation well in hand and will be able to effectively enforce the same laws necessary to the protection of the fish in the future.

The speaker, in an interesting way, told about the tireless efforts of the game commission, the Jackson County and Josephine County Game Protective associations in attempting to preserve the fish in the streams of this section. He told about one case where a man had gone over the limit at Fish lake last summer to the extent of catching 150 fish in one day. The speaker urged organized support of

the same laws and community cooperation in developing Rogue river and its fishing attractions into one of the largest resources in the valley.

## REFRIGERATION IS TOPIC AT FORUM

The importance of year round refrigeration and its relation to the health and happiness of the American people was the subject of an interesting talk before the Copeo employes club this noon.

F. H. Hull, district supervisor for the General Electric company refrigerator, speaker of the day, brought out many important points on food preservation and why it is vital to health. "Watch the temperature in your refrigerator," said the speaker. "If it goes above fifty degrees your food is not being safely preserved." The national slogan is "Below 50 degrees—safety, above 50 degrees—danger."

Mr. Hull's remarks were illustrated with charts and a clever moving exhibit showing the cycle of refrigeration in a General Electric refrigerator.

George Neuner, United States district attorney was another guest of the forum today who contributed to the enjoyment of the program with a number of interesting experiences encountered in various sessions of federal court.

Before closing, H. L. Bromley, chairman of the meeting, introduced Lloyd Williamson, who has just returned from the National Legion convention at Louisville where he captured fourth place in the drum majors competition. Williamson will give an account of his trip at the next forum meeting, Thursday, Oct. 17th.
