DON CLARK IS LEADING FIELD IN TITLE PLAY

Local Player Shoots 76 to Qualify in First Flight for Southern Oregon Title Tournament — Rain Reduces Visiting List.

At press time Don Clark had the low medal score in the qualifying round of the Southern Oregon golf championship which started at the local club this morning. Clark shot a 76—six over par, closely followed by Hank Pringle with a 79.

Because of the rain the course was slow, and under the circumstances the scores were regarded as good. The low man for the visitors in the morning round was H. R. Bentley of Ashland with an 82, followed by E. R. Peterson of Seattle with an 85.

HILL BREAKS RIBS JUGGLING ANIMALS

Dewey Hill of Prospect was in the city today seeking medical aid for two broken ribs, sustained in an unusual manner.

About a month ago Mr. Hill stood watching a number of Medford people trying to get a steer into a truck. When all their efforts failed, Mr. Hill, who is a sturdy and hardy mountaineer, picked up the steer and threw his steership into the truck.

Last week he went hunting in Klamath county and killed a 400 pound mule deer. He then packed the mule deer six miles on his back.

He returned to Prospect, where he is James E. Griev's generalissimo, and his employer became aware of a pain in his hired man's side. He promptly brought him to Medford.

Mr. Griev thinks that his No. 1 man broke his ribs while handling the steer, but did not know it, and re-broke them after they had partially healed, while packing the mule deer.
